Robert and Margaret Lisle are given in most assembled genealogies as the parents of Joshua, but this does not seem to have been definitely established. Another researcher gives Joshua's parent as Hugh Whitaker and his grandfather as Christopher Whitaker (The Genealogist Vol. 6, 1882, pp. 12-15.)

It is not known if the following Whitakers are related to our line: Passengers and Ships prior to 1684 to Penn's Colony pp. 89 and 162, show a John Nixon and wife Margery and children John, Thomas, James, Jehemiah, Joseph Frederick, May, Jane, Margert, and Elizabeth Nixon arriving in Philadelphia from London on the ship "Endeavor" p. 29, with servant James Whitaker (Witaker). By a warrant on the 6th day. 8th month 1693, 300 acres are laid out for Nixon in Providence Township, Chester County, of which he was a constable. Whitaker was on the grand jury in Chester County in 1690, but did not take up his headland until 1709. Chester Court Records 86, 162 (or 216) Pennsylvania Archives, Series III, 150, 177 p. 183 lists Whitaker settling in Darby Township, Chester County, in 1715.

Joshua Whitaker was a Quaker. He was fighting during the Jacobite rebellion against the King of England when he was killed on the Isle of Man.

Notes for JANE BANISTER PARKER:

Notes for WILLIAM WHITAKER:

Quaker records in Dublin, Ireland show that William in 1719 desired a certificate to the monthly meeting. Kennett Square, Pennsylvania. After his marriage to Elizabeth Carleton, William lived in Kennett Square. Chester County, PA from 1722 to 1734, when they moved to Bradford, also in Chester County, A list of land warrants in Bradford and vicinity, August 1734, shows William Whitaker with 100 acres of land next to Nathaniel Newton and William Buffington. Four years later, in December of 1739, he and his family were all packed and ready to move back to Kennett Square when a catastrophic fire destroyed their home and nearly all they owned, including the seed intended for spring planting. The only thing saved was their family Bible, which still carries the marks of fire damage. It has come down through the family and is currently in the possession of Mrs. M. L. Kirstein of Asheville, North Carolina. Since the fire left them nearly destitute, they were in danger of requiring relief from the Quaker Society, Because they Extended the Bradford Meeting, but still belonged to the Kennett Monthly Meeting, there was some dispute about which Quaker Congregation would help them, but this was settled by an agreement reached by the two groups on Sept. 17, 1741 (7-17-1741 per Quaker calender) by which the Kennett Monthly Meeting agreed to contribute three quarters of their needs and the Bradford Meeting contributed one a quarter of their needs. This was conditioned on the Bradford meeting receiving the Whitaker family's membership from Kennett, with the result that they were received as members of Bradford on May 20, 1742. This was the same day that their daughter, Lydia, was excluded from membership for marrying a man outside their faith. As late as September 1747, William Whitaker was still receiving help from the Society at the rate of 20 shillings per month.

When their situation did not improve, the family requested on July 18, 1-51 a Certificate of Removal from Bradford Monthly Meeting to go to North Carolina. At the same time, their son Mark made a similar request, indicating that he was over 21 years of age. William's request was granted on August 15, 1751, but an objection was raised about Mark and his request was not approved until December 19, 1752. It is not known if William left in 1751 or waited for Mark's request to be approved. Some people think they stayed briefly in Augusta County. Virginia because of Indian troubles, but this is not known for certain. However, they were in North Carolina before 1755, the year that Mark bought land there. The earliest tax list for Rowan County in 1759 shows William Whitaker, Joshua Whitaker, and Eldad Reed living in the area between Abbotts and Swearing Creeks near Jersey Baptist Church in what is now Davidson County. Eldad Reed married William's daughter Jane Whitaker. Apparently by the time they reached North Carolina all the family had left the Quaker faith, for their letter of removal from the Bradford Monthly Meeting was never presented to another Meeting. William Jr. became a Methodist, but all the rest of the family changed to the Baptist Church. The Whitaker North Carolina line is traced in The Whitakers of Buncombe County, North Carolina by C. Bruce Whitaker. The sub-title is: The Ancestry and Descendants of Joshua Whitaker 1676-1715. Buncombe County encompasses the city of Asheville.

Notes for PETER WHITAKER:

Peter and his brother William came to Chester County, Pennsylvania about 1720-21. Peter was present at William's wedding on February 13, 1722 at the Kennett Square Meeting. Peter was received for membership at Kennett Square Monthly Meeting on certification from New Garden Monthly Meeting. Peter and Mary Huntley announced their marriage intentions at Kennett Monthly Meeting on January 2, 1725. Their second announcement was made on February 06, 1725. They were married on February 17, 1725 at the Kennett Meeting House in Kennett Square, Pennsylvania. Those in attendance included his mother Jane Whitaker, brother William, and sister Katherine Holman and her husband Charles. Mary was the daughter of William Huntley, also of Chester County. Peter had been given a Penn grant. He built his home near Wagonville about 1736. He was very successful, and at the time of his death he owned 1,220 acres of land and the largest brewery in Chester County. His wife Mary was appointed administratrix. His only son John inherited his estate. After Peter's death, Mary remarried. On August 18, 1767, Mary Whitaker of West Caln, widow, married Jacob Way of Kennett Square at Kennett Monthly Meeting. Mary Whitaker Way of West Caln Township died in 1786. The Chester County Will Book 8, p. 38, will dated on December 23, 1785, proved Feb. 10, 1786, shows that John Whitaker, the only child of Peter and Mary, inherited 1500 acres of land and 1700 pounds in cash from his parents.

Notes for JOHN SR. WHITAKER:

John Whitaker, Jr. was a "baggage master" or quartermaster for General Braddock in the King's Service and fought in 1750-51. He was a Captain in the British army at that time. Because of the Indian Wars, John insisted that his neighbors become familiar with arms. This was against the Quaker belief. They held a Church trial and John refused to bow to his elders and give up his arms or the training of his neighbors, so he was dismissed from the Quaker Meeting. His wife refused to go against her husband and she too was dismissed. She was not a Quaker when she died in 1768. After Dinah's death, John married Ann Pyle, daughter of Job Pyle. They had nine sons. There are forty years difference in age between John's oldest and youngest children. He named his seventh child by his first wife John, and his first son by his second wife. John A. Jr. This has created much confusion in tracing family records. In the Revolutionary War, John served as a private in a company of Rangers guarding the frontier. He served under Captains Flanagan and Anderson in the 3rd Battalion, Pennsylvania Troops, 1778-1783. A reference in the DAR Lineage Book. Volume 58, p. 68 states that he was captured and escaped from a prison ship, made possible because he was a powerful man. Sometime before his death in 1826, he was reunited with the Quakers, as he is buried in the West Caln Burial Ground next to the Quaker meeting house, Chester County, Pennsylvania.

 ROBERT⁴ WHITAKER (JOSHUA SR³, ROBERT², WILLIAM¹ WHITACRE) was born 1705 in Yorkshire, England, and died 1754 in Cecil County, Maryland. He married MARY ANN HALL November 28, 1725 in Kennet Square, Chester County, PA, daughter of SAMUEL HALL and ELIZABETH. Notes for ROBERT WHITAKER:

Robert Whitaker purchased 100 acres in Cecil County, Maryland in 1735. It is not known if he is related to Moses Whitaker who is listed in Kent County, Maryland in 1716.

"Whitaker 1086-1990" was written by Bill Whitaker, a fifth generation Kentuckian from Perry County. He was born December 27, 1930, died abt. 1998 on the Whitaker Fork of Big Creek about 300 yards from the Leslies County Line. He grew up on a hillside farm where he worked. After finishing eighth grade at the Whitaker School in 1944, he left home to attend high school at Buckhorn, where he milked six cows every morning and evening to pay half of his \$24 per month tuition. From age 17 to 37, he was in the U.S. Air Force. He flew combat missions as a tail gunner during the Korean War and was a boom operator (in-flight refueling technician) on the K-C 135 tanker during the Vietnam War. He retired on July 01, 1968 as a master sergeant. While in the Air Force, Bill took up golf in 1958 and became a scratch player within a year. A week before his retirement, he won the National Lefthanders Championship in Washington, DC. His interest in golf took him to Lake City Junior College in Florida where he studied golf course operations and graduated wih an A.S. degree. After graduation, he was the golf course manager at some of the finest private golf clubs in South Florida until June 1989, when he retired for the second time. The summer of 1990, he returned to his grandfather's old home place on Big Creek and planted the garden for the first time in 43 years. He made his summer home there until his death from cancer. Bill Whitaker's book has some errors regarding ancestors earlier than Joshua Whitaker.

Robert Whitaker came to America in 1722 with his mother and settled in Chester County, Pennsylvania. Shortly thereafter, he moved to Maryland, according to tradition. His son, Thomas, married November 01, 1760 Elizabeth Rogers.

Robert Whitaker's will in the Maryland State Archive, Annapolis, names children Samuel, Thomas, Ralph, Ann, Phebe, Esther, and Millicent. It was witnessed by Samuel Gilpin, Samuel Bond, and Robert Oldham.

Notes for THOMAS WHITAKER:

Thomas Whitaker was born May 29, 1731 in East Nottingham Hundred, Cecil County, Maryland, and died July 1794 in Burgettstown, Washington County, Pa. The will of his father, Robert, directed him to take care of his younger siblings.

He was in Captain James Gibson's Company 4th battalion of the Cumberland County militia in 1777. He died on his land, "Free and Easy" in Burgettstown, Washington County, Pa.

From DAR accounts: Before 1777, Thomas Whitaker and family lived at or near Hagerstown, Maryland. About 1782 or 1783, they located near Burgettstown, Pennsylvania. His wife Elizabeth was born 1743 and died 1810. Son Deacon Whitaker, b. November 16, 1785, married Rachel Rogers. Son Eli, born June 05, 1789, married Mary Cherry. Son Samuel, born November 19, 1761, married Isabel.

Boyd Crumrine's History of Washington County Pennsylvania, Smith Township, pp. 914-915, notes that he was a resident of the township before 1786. "On the 21st of February of that year, he took out a warrant for 400 acres of land, which was surveyed to him by the name of "Slow and Easy." It was adjoining the "West Boston" tract on which Burgettstown was laid out. On this farm, he lived until his death in July 1794. He left a widow, Elizabeth, and sons Samuel, Eli and Dacon (sic) and daughters Ann (Holmes). Mary (Hall), Elizabeth (Chamberlain), Sarah, Rachel, and Esther. In the year 1806, two hundred acres of the farm was sold to Josiah Patterson, and upon the death of Mr. Whittaker (sic), the remainder of the farm was left to Samuel Whittaker, who in later years conveyed it to his son Dacon. It was inherited by his (Deacon's) daughter, Mrs. G. N. Tenan, who now (1882) occupies it."

Notes for SAMUEL WHITAKER:

Samuel Whitaker's will dated June 14, 1838 was probated May 6, 1840. He wrote "I give and bequeath to my well beloved wife Isabella all my personal property remaining after my debts and funeral expenses are paid, also the use of the farm on which I now live during her natural lifetime, or while she remains my widow, also my daughter Isabella to have her living on said farm during the life or widowhood of her mother if she remains single so long. It is my will that my son Deacon Whitaker have the use of the farm on which he now lives during the lifetime of my wife and at her death I authorize (sic) my executor to sell the said farm and make a deed of conveyance to the purchases and to divide the proceeds equally amongst my son Samuel Whitaker, my daughters Eliazabeth Culbertson, and Isabella Whitaker, and my son William Whitaker. I give and bequeath to my son Deacon Whitaker and to his heirs forever the plantation on which I now live after my wife is done with it on the following conditions, viz. That the farm be valued by three men agreed upon by those interested and that the one half of the valuation be equally divided amongst my son Samuel Whitaker, William Whitaker, my son John's three children. Isabella, Mary and John, together equal to my other children and my daughter Elizabeth Culbertson and Isabella Whitaker to be paid in four equal annual payments to each commencing one year after the possession of my wife ceases. It is my will that the son which my daughter Isabella now has be entitled to the same right and title to all his mother's shares as if he was a legal heir. Also I do not allow any part of my property bequeathed to my son William to be applied to pay any judgment heretofore obtained against him..." signed June 04, 1839.

This indicates that Samuel Whitaker Bell was born in 1838, not later as some records indicate. Apparently he was born out of wedlock, so the identity of his father is not confirmed. There is some speculation that Isabella's wayward brother William was responsible for incest.

A.D. White, Washington County historian, visited and listed the remaining stones that can be read in the Whitaker Family Graveyard. He wrote:

This old family burial ground is located on the former Deacon Whitaker farm on a hill about one-half mile north of the Burgettstown Borough line. It was a plot only about 50 feet X 50 feet in size and was at one time enclosed by a wire fence, with a few of the old posts still in place to mark the boundary. The old yard was visited on May 11, 1970 by Mrs. Edward Hamilton of Burgettstown and A.D. White of Hickory, and the following information was taken from the few gravestones remaining:

- Isabel, wife of Samuel Whitaker, died July 18, 1848, aged 74 years.

Deacon (sometimes spelled "Dacon") Whitaker died July 11, 1875, aged 65 years, 1 month, 4 days.

"The Lord is my Shepherd,

I shall not want."

Jane Whitaker, born February 16, 1812, died November 8, 1888.

Samuel, son of Deacon and Jane Whitaker, died May 6, 1850, aged 19 months, 20 days.

Note: There are numerous field stones set on edge in this old yard, but no identifiable inscriptions on them. They may mark the locations of earlier graves in this yard, indicating that quite a number of people may be buried here with only these "blank" stones to note their places of burial.

For the consideration of thirty-five pounds, he bought seventy acres of land of Henry Purviance, a part of that patented by Purviance in September 1788. The farm upon which he resided in this township is still known as the McClurg farm, and is now the property of William Porter, a descendant of the McClurg family."

If her surname was McClung, she could be the daughter of William McClung, who died September 18, 1842, aged eighty years, and is buried in the graveyard of the Tucker Meeting House in Paris where James Caldwell, who died October 10, 1837, aged seventy-six years, is also buried.

Her husband was named as William Bell of Hanover Twp. just before she died at the age of 41 on December 23, 1852.

From Beers' History of Washington County: William Bell married Rachel Stroud Smith Bell after Isabella's death in 1852. (Rachel Stoud m. (1)? Smith, (2) William Bell of Smith Twp., (3) Samuel Christ - his third wife). The children of Isabella, Deacon, Sarah Ann, and John, sued in Washington County Orphans Court record.

Beaver County, Pennsylvania Will Book D, p. 454, and Register's Document # 2, p. 179 have the following information: William N. Bell died February 28, 1866.

Deacon Bell's third wife stated on an application form that both of her husband's parents had been born in England. Deacon was prone to untruths, a trait which family members have often attributed to him.

County of Beaver, State of Pennsylvania: First after all my lawful debts are paid and discharged, the residue of my estate real and personal, I give and bequeath and dispose of as follows: To my beloved wife Rachel Bell, one house and lot known as my part of the property purchased from James Knowles and all appurtenances situated thereon, situated in Raccoon Township, Beaver County, Pa., together with one horse, one cow, and two hogs, also farming utensils and household furniture, brooms, and broom findings, the said property, if any left at her death to be divided equally between my heirs, and to my sons John Bell and Deacon Bell and my daughter Sarah Ann Bell I do bequeath three dollars to be divided equally to them. Likewise, I make constitute and appoint my said beloved wife to be Executress of this my will and testament, in witness whereof I have hereunto subscribed my name and affixed my seal this 22nd day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six. Witnessed by William Elliott, James Knowles, and Samuel Lyons.

Washington County, Pennsylvania Early Deaths obtained at the Courthouse by Raymond Martin Bell. On page 36, the following appears:

Isabella, daughter of Samuel and Isabella Whitaker, formerly McClurg, or McCleery, white female. Wife of William N. Bell.

Raymond Martin Bell reports: The children of Isabel Whitaker Bell, John, Deacon, and Sarah Ann, each filed a petition on May 23, 1869 (Orphans Court Book L, pp. 163, 164, 165). William N. as administrator for Isabella evidently had some money due the children. In 1869, they were all over 21, so they sued the executor - Rachel of the William N. estate. Raymond M. Bell could not locate the final disposition of the suits.

- 2. May 1853, James L. Patterson appointed guardian for John, Deacon, Sarah Ann.

- 8. William Bell died in Beaver County, Rachel Bell executor.
- Petitioner prays that a citation be issued to constrain (urge) settlement of guardian account. The citation was issued January 25, August 19, October 18. No more after that.

Samuel Whitaker was born in Burgettstown, Pa. and lived in Muskingum County, Ohio, Polk County and Story County, both in Iowa. His occupation was as farmer.

Samuel's death certificate says that he died at 1 a.m. on October 11, 1915 of monmitral regurgitation, general

dropsy.

When he was 20 years old (1860 census), Sam Whitaker worked as a farm laborer for his neighbor William Kennison Wood. W. K. Wood was one of the grown sons of John G. Wood and his first wife, Anna Kennison Wood. The second Mrs. John G. Wood had been Eliza Jane Miller before her marriage to John G. Also living in the J.G. Wood household was Harriet Priscilla Miller, Eliza Jane's daughter. Harriet had an illegitimate child said to have been fathered by one of the Wood men in 1856. Four years later, Harriet married Sam Whitaker. Her little girl Emma stayed in the Wood home for several years before moving into the Sam Whitaker household at about age 8.

Samuel and Laura Wheeler also raised their granddaughter Caroline "Carrie" Jones, daughter of Al and Mary

He married MARY AGNES CALDWELL2. March 28, 1861 in Burgettstown, Washington County, Pennsylvania, daughter of JOHN CALDWELL and MARY DORNAN. She was born November 08, 1842 in Paris, Washington County, Pennsylvania, and died November 24, 1924 in Marietta, Ohio.

Notes for SAMUEL WHITAKER BELL:

Inventor. Went to California for gold by sea, returned by land.

There is a discrepancy regarding the birth date of Samuel Whitaker Bell and whether or not William Bell was his natural father. According to the family bible records, he was born on March 31, 1841. In addition, the will of his grandfather, Samuel Whitaker, refers to Isabelle's "natural son." However, his obituary in the Marietta, Ohio newspaper dated Saturday, May 16, 1919, states that he was 81 years old. This means that he would have been born in 1838. This latter date is no doubt the correct one, as the Samuel Whitaker will, dated June 14, 1838 and probated May 06, 1840 gives him "same rights and title to his mother's shares as if he were a legal heir."

The obituary reads as follows: "Samuel Whitaker Bell, 81 years old, died at his home at 314 1/2 Washington Street this morning at 10;30 o'clock. He had been seriously ill for over two weeks with heart trouble and double pneumonia. He had been in a delicate condition ever since March 1915 when he was seriously ill with pneumonia.

"He was born in Burgettstown, Pa. March 31, 1838. On March 28, 1861, he was united in marriage to Mary Agnes Caldwell of Burgettstown and to this union were born four children who all are now living. Mr. Bell was a member of the Presbyterian Church.

"Besides his wife, the deceased is survived by the following children: Harry Bell, Collier, West Virginia; Mrs. A. E. Stewart (sic) of Clarksburg, West Virginia: Mrs. W. W. Walker, Parkersburg, West Virginia; and Mrs. James M. Hamilton of this city (Marietta, Ohio).

"Funeral arrangements have not been made yet, but will be announced at the Presbyterian Church tomorrow."

Another obituary in the Marietta Times, May 17, 1919 reads: Mr. Samuel Whittaker Bell. 82, an aged and respected resident of this city, died Saturday morning at 10:30 o'clock in his home. No. 314 1/2 Washington Street. Death was due to pneumonia and complications. He had been blind for over a year.

Mr. Bell was born at Burgettstown, Washington County, Pennsylvania, his parents being pioneer settlers of that place. He was a member of the Odd Fellows and Masonic lodges of the city and a member of the First Presbyterian Church. He was well known throughout the city, where he had lived for about 20 years.

Mr. Bell is survived by his wife, Mrs. Mary A. Caldwell Bell; one son, Harry Bell, of Colliers WV; and three daughters, Mrs. James M. Hamilton, of Marietta; Mrs. A. E. Stewart, of Clarksburg, WV; Mrs. W. W. Walker of Parkersburg. A brother, Deacon W. Bell, of Indianapolis, Ind., also survives.

The S. W. Bell residence in Marietta, Ohio was on Putnam Street. It has since been restored.

A third obituary ran in the Marietta (Ohio) Sunday Morning Observer, Sunday. May 18, 1919, p. 4, column 4, news section: Samuel Whittaker Bell, 82, died at his home on Washington Street. Saturday morning, May 17, of pneumonia. He was born at Burgettstown, Washington County, Pa. He was a member of the Odd Fellows and Masonic lodges of the city and a member of the First Prersbyterian Church. Mr. Bell is survived by his wife, Mrs. Mary A. Caldwell Bell; one son, Harry Bell of Colliers, WV and three daughters, Mrs. James M. Hamilton, of Marietta; Mrs. E. A. Stewart (sic), of Clarksburg, WV; Mrs. W. Walker of Parkersburg. A brother, Deacon W. Bell of Indianapolis, Ind., also survives.

An ambrotype (earlier version of a callotype) of Samuel Whitaker Bell is paired with a tintype of Mary Agnes Caldwell bell, with tinted cheeks. Most records say that she was born November 08, 1842. They were married March 28, 1861. A note beneath her picture dated November 28, 1860 says that she is 19 years, 20 days old, thereby proving the November date as opposed to January of the same year which has appeared in some records. The noted says: "Presented to SB by the Intended one, M.A.C."

An incomplete deed (date missing) from Finley Scott and Theresa Scott to Samuel W. Bell and David Culbertson for twelve hundred dollars is for land in Washington County purchased by the Scotts October 11, 1850 from Josiah Scott and Jane his wife March 05, 1856, to them from Thomas Gornley (or Gormey) to John

Provines May 04, 1849, to them from Robert Roland April 01, 1831, earlier recorded in Book M. Vol. 3, page 6.

Uda Bell Stuart wrote the following about her father during the 1930s when she was living in Pittsburgh with her daughter, Adelaide Stuart Pritchard:

"My father, S. W. Bell, was one of the 49ers to California to seek his fortune in the gold mines. He went by water, a terrible experience in those days. (Note: Although all who sought gold in California were called 49ers, many went there long after that date. Family records indicate that he must have gone about 1864, perhaps to avoid the Civil War.) He left Mother and Harry, and Flo was born in a log cabin. He brought home "Experiences" and gold nuggets and some souvenirs and satin. Sold gold ring...solid silver ring, etc. He was chased, terrorized.

"His mother's people were the Whitakers. Uncle Deacon Bell and Samuel Whitaker Bell were brothers. His mother, Isabella Whitaker, was a beautiful woman with blue eyes, auburn (gold) sun kissed curly hair and a pink and white exquisite complexion. Flo, Grandpa, Harold inherited her complexion, eyes and hair. The Whitakers were among the first white settlers in Washington County about where Burgettstown is now. They staked a 'tomahawk' claim by nicking trees for their 'clearing.' As far as the trees were nicked was the 'white man's.'

"My dear father, Samuel Whitaker Bell, died in Marietta, Ohio on Saturday, May 17, 1919, at 10:00 a.m. Heart, pneumonia, blind. My dear Father fell asleep in Jesus."

In a jewelry box accompanying her note is a bright auburn curl, "a lock of his hair when a young man."

Notes for MARY AGNES CALDWELL:

Before her marriage to Samuel Whitaker Bell, May Agnes Caldwell was keeping house in Paris, Washington County, Pennsylvania, for Matthew (83 years) and Elizabeth Caldwell (72) Russell, who was born in 1788. Elizabeth was her aunt, the older sister of her father, John Caldwell.

Item from the Parkersburg, West Virginia newspaper November 25, 1924: "Mrs. W. W. Walker received the sad news this morning of the death of her mother, Mrs. Samuel W. Bell, which occurred during the night at her home in Marietta after a brief illness of pneumonia. The news came as a great shock to Mrs. Walker, who was not expecting her mother's death, for while she had not been well for the past few days, her illness was not considered serious.

"The deceased was a prominent and respected woman who with her husband and other members of the family came to Marietta from Burgettstown, Pa. twenty-five years ago to reside. She has many friends here who sympathize deeply with Mrs. Walker in her loss.

"Mrs. Walker left at once for Marietta to remain until after the funeral."

The family bible says that Mary Agnes Caldwell was born on November 08, 1842. A note beneath her picture dated November 28, 1860 says that she is 19 years, 20 days old. Therefore, she would have been born in 1841, not 1842.

The obituary notice appeared in the Marietta Times, Wednesday, November 26, 1924, p. 5, column 5: Death Claims Mrs. Mary Bell

Mrs. Mary Agnes Bell, aged 84 years, died on Wednesday morning at 3 o'clock at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Flora Hamilton, at 501 1/2 Warren Street. Her death followed a three days illness with pneumonia.

Mrs. Bell was the widow of Samuel W. Bell who died in this city six years ago. The couple came to Marietta about 16 years ago from Meadville, Pa. Since the death of her husband, Mrs. Bell had made her home with Mrs. Hamilton.

One son and three daughters survive. They are Harry Bell, of Burgettstown, Pa.; Mrs. Uda Stuart, of Clarksburg, WV., Mrs. Jennie Walker, of Parkersburg, WV; and Mrs. Hamilton. Mrs. Henry B. Jett of Fourth Street is a granddaughter of the deceased.

From her girlhood, Mrs. Bell was a member of the Presbyterian Church. During her residence in this city, she was a member of the First Presbyterian Church.

Funeral services will be held at the Hamilton home and burial will be made at Parkersburg.

Notes for JEAN A. BELL:

Here follows a letter written by Jeanne (Jen) Bell Walker to Lena Gregg, of Bethesda, Ohio, a niece. It is dated March 26, 1948 and was mailed in Parkersburg, WV:

Got your letter and can't read it and can't see to write to you. I am 75 and nearly blind like Grandpa. I am staying in a tourist home because of the housing shortage and I have no place to go. I have been beaten out of all I used to own, and have no home. I am sick and have no one to take care of me, and an income of \$100 a month to live on. You asked about Uda. She is in Swarthmore, a suburb of Philadelphia. She fell and broke her hip. She fell at Adelaide's house. She is five years older that I am. Uda's address is c/o of her daughter, Adelaide (Stuart), Mrs. E. M. Pritchard, 206 Dickinson Avenue, Swarthmore, Pa.

Mr. Pritchard is a technician with the American Telephone & Telegraph Company there and is a grand guy. Adelaide, his wife, is a grand girl. She has one daughter 16 years old who will graduate in June. Adelaide is very pretty and has been healthy, but she took a sudden illness and nearly died. She came home to build up for a major operation when Uda went over to help her and fell and broke her hip.

I can't see to write to any of them or see to read their letters when they write to me. Adelaide gets up at 6:00 a.m. and gets Ernest off to work at 7:00 a.m. He works until 6:00 every night and comes hope to dinner, and he leaves the next morning at 7:00 to go back to Philadelphia and has a full day and gets very little rest. Virginia Stuart is Uda's other daughter. (Mrs. Joseph S. Goode). Auburn, Ritchie County, West Virginia. They had a 400-acre farm there. He was a sheep breeder and a farmer. Joe was sheriff in that county, but when the banks closed he lost his farm. Virginia has a son and daughter. The daughter is married and has a little girl 3 or 4 years old. Her husband was overseas and was a pharmacist's mate. He is home now and is training to be a doctor and surgeon. He goes to school at Morgantown. Adelaide and her little girl live with Virginia.

Virginia's husband, Joe, has been doing work at Canton. Ohio with the Timken Roller Bearing people since the war, and they have bought a little house in this little country town. I lived in the...(missing)

Flora is about 14 years younger than I and she has a position with the Internal Revenue Office here. She was Mrs. Henry B. Jett and he had been Cashier of the German National Bank in Marietta and they had one son. William Hamilton Jett, who died just before he was to be graduated. Flora's mother and father are both dead. She had lived with me 15 years and she is living by herself now. Her husband is dead. She is on her own and would not even lift her hand to help me out in any way. She was raised a pet, if you know what that means, and was a spoiled brat. Flora was ungrateful and impudent and overbearing, and after 15 years I had to quit her. I couldn't stand her anymore. She is on her own now, and I am too, and I would not ask her to do anything for me if I were dying. I am almost helpless and have to pay \$16 per week for two rooms, and have been gypped out of everything I had. My husband is dead, and I have nothing but trouble.

I have some beautiful furniture in storage, and chinaware. I had lovely things, but they are all in storage and I have not seen my trunks for two years. Lovely silverware and linens, but have to keep them all in storage. I will have to have some help of some kind or I am going to die here. I have several thousand dollars worth of lovely rugs and things and have \$100 a month income and can still make my own way. I could convert them into cash if I could find a place to spread them out and sell them.

Is there anything that Marie or you could do to see that I am taken care of? I have to go out for my meals and have cataracts on my eyes and can hardly see. I am afraid I will fall in the street, or get struck by an auto and get killed on the street. I have been sick all winter and so many things have been stolen from me. I have to move from the tourist home I am in now, as they claim they can get so much more for the rooms renting them for just one night at a time. I have to move and have no place to go.

How far is Bethesda from Marietta, Ohio? Marietta is only 12 miles from Parkersburg. I live at 1039 Murdoch Avenue, Parkersburg, WV, at Fockner Tourist Home, and my own private telephone in my room is 63°1-J. He asked me to vacate these rooms last Tuesday and I was foolish to pay that much all winter. Could you and your husband drive down to see me? I could talk to you so much better than I can have someone write for me.

Please write me by return mail in the enclosed envelope and tell me if you can be of any service to me. Could I come to you or get some place near you? I can get around and make my own bed and dress myself and have enough to live on if I could get someone to take care of me.

It costs so much to move from the storage I want to make one move do it all, so please let me hear from you by return mail.

Love, Aunt Jen

P.S. Please forward this letter to Marie at once just as soon as you read it. Also let Bill know immediately. (Included with the letter was a warehouse receipt from George L. Buckley's Transfer and Storage, 815

Jeannette Street, East End, Parkersburg, WV, dated April 29, 1948 for a large list of articles from her home.)

A letter to Emily Cary from Jessie M. Givens of Parkersburg, WV dated July 06, 1976 reads in part:
"I knew Mrs. W. W. Walker quite well, as I waited on her almost daily when I worked at Montgomery Wards. She like me to wait on her. I would hear her talk about Flora Jett, and in the end it was Mrs. Jett who had her committed to Spencer State Hospital, and the poor thing died there. I never knew what happened to Mrs. Walker's furniture, etc...Mrs. Jett was retired from the Internal Revenue Service."

A note from Frank S. Dodd of The Parkersburg Sentinel reads as follows:

"The following information has been provided by Mt. Olivet Cemetery, through the Masonic Temple. Parkersburg, WV, and the Leavitt Funeral Home, Parkersburg, WV.

"Mary Agnes Bell, died November 26, 1924, buried in Mt. Olivet Cemetery by Leavitt Funeral Home. (Leavitt's has some sketchy information for 1924, but Mrs. Bell is not listed with the funeral home this information came from the Masonic Temple, caretakers of the cemetery. Not sure if the date is date of death of date of burial.)

"Jennie Bell Walker, 80, died in Spencer, Roane County, WV, June 09, 1954. Buried by Leavitt Funeral Home in Mt. Olivet Cemetery on June 12, 1954. Funeral service was at Leavitt's at 10:30 a.m., Saturday, June 12, 1954, with the Rev. William Ferry (who was the minister of the First Presbyterian Church in Parkersburg) officiating."

(Samuel Whitaker Bell is also buried in Mt. Olivet.)

Notes for WILLIAM W. WALKER:

W.W. Walker's funeral on November 28 (year not specified) cost \$527.55, a large sum for the period in question (mid-1930s). This occurred after his divorce from Jean (Jen) Bell Walker. At the time of his death, Jen had driven his expensive car to Auburn, West Virginia to visit the Goode family. The car was impounded and kept locked in an Auburn garage for a long period, causing Jen much vexation.

He married (1) MARGARETTA SMITH June 15, 1861 in Washington County or Beaver County, Pennsylvania. He married (2) MARY ANN STEWART October 30, 1872 in Bridgeport, St. Clairsville, Belmont County, Ohio. She was born November 09, 1850 in Ohio, and died October 28, 1930 in 46 Whittier Place, Indianapolis, Indiana. He married (3) CORA B. GIDEON December 21, 1931 in Pinellas County, Florida. She was born October 13, 1871 in Mantoon, Illinois.

Notes for DEACON BELL:

Deacon Bell died on August 08, 1936. His third wife received a bill for \$468.00 from McNeely and Sons Mortuary, 1828 North Meridian St., Indianapolis, dated August 10, 1936. According to a form signed by Cora B. Bell, Deacon had a heart attack on August 03, 1936 at the age of 94. The doctor was called on August 04, 1936 and the nursing bill by Mrs. Daisy Hitchcock of \$10 had been paid. His wife received \$100 from the government and \$100 from the Odd Fellows Death Benefit.

Deacon Bell was the legitimate son of Isabelle Whitaker Bell and William Bell. His older brother, Samuel Whitaker Bell, may very likely have been born out of wedlock, according to the will made by his grandfather, Samuel Whitaker, which asked that S.W. be granted the right to his inheritance as would any legal heir. Deacon was always regarded by other family members as the black sheep because of the many untruths attributed to him and his knack for taking what belonged to others through corrupt "deals."

During the Civil War, Deacon Whitaker Bell was a volunteer enlistee from the State of Pennsylvania, town of New Brighton. He stated that he was born in Washington County and was a fireman by occupation. (This presumably was with the Pennsylvania Railroad.) His enlistment form dated Mary 19, 1864 notes that he was married. The address of his wife at the time, Margaretta, was given as Industry. Beaver County, Pa. During his service, Deacon was a private with Company C of the 22nd Pennsylvania Regiment.

The Company Muster Roll says that Deacon was absent from June-July 1864 on detached service (dismounted camp in Martinsburg, Virginia). In August, October and November 1964, he was again absent, later attributed to sickness. In June 1865, he was transferred to Company B at New Creek, West Virginia. A hospital record from G. H. Patterson Park, Baltimore, Maryland dated August 16, 1864 says that he was admitted on July 26, 1864 from Harpers Ferry by way of Frederick City (Frederick, Maryland?) The diagnosis was mental

derangement: Religious mania. He was transferred to Philadelphia on August 16, 1864. On December 02, 1864, he was designated a straggler at Pittsburgh, Pa. The remarks state that he overstayed his furlough and reported at these headquarters from transfer and was forwarded as a straggler at the cost of transportation to Philadelphia, \$7.32. He was described as being 5 feet 9 inches tall, light complexion, grey eyes, and light hair. He was mustered out at Cumberland, Maryland on October 31, 1865. His third wife's application for the Civil War pension states that he served as Private, Company A, 3rd Regiment, Pennsylvania Provisional Cavalry, volunteer, He was pensioner of the U.S. by Certificate No. XC-2567.454.

On February 12, 1925, Deacon was seen by the Veterans Hospital in Indianapolis, Indiana, Marion County, for chills and fever caused by malaria. The doctor stated that he had been confined to his bed with uremia from January 18, 1925. Because of his condition, an x-ray was not recommended. His third wife, Cora B. Gideon, whom he married in Pinellas County, Florida on December 21, 1931, was nearly 30 years his junior. She gave her age at the time of their marriage as 65. Her first husband, Alfred Gideon, died August 8, 1913 at Decatur Illinois.

In a form which he completed for the U.S. Department of the Interior, dated October 6, 1923, Deacon stated that his wife (at that time) was Mary Ann Stewart. (In one place, he called her Annie.) They were married October 30, 1872 at Bridgeport, Ohio by Rev. Hudson, a Methodist Episcopal Minister. He said that his first wife was Margaretta Smith whom he married June 15, 1861. He said that he had a decree of divorce given by the Common Pleas Court of St. Clairsville, Belmont County, Ohio, in 1872. He said that by his first wife, he had two boys, William N. Bell, born June 1862, and Albert E. Bell, born July 1863. With his present wife, he had one daughter, Mrs. Thomas W. McLean, born April 1878. In his third wife's application for reimbursement for his burial from the Veterans Administration in August 1936, she stated that his two former wives were dead. She identified his daughter as Mrs. Clyde McLean, age 55 years. Deacon's death certificate incorrectly stated that both his mother and father had been born in England. At the time of death, he lived at 201 No. Randolph, Indianapolis, Indiana. He was buried at Memorial Park Cemetery in that city.

A letter from Ilene Learn dated March 28, 1977 includes the following: "I am enclosing a snapshot of granddad that was taken in 1933. I believe Harold Jett (son of Flora Hamilton Jett) took the picture of him. (When he visited us with Deacon Bell, he was wearing his military school uniform with high, polished boots.)

"Grandfather was crippled. We think he had infantile paralysis as a child. He was crippled from the time he was 3 or 4 years of age; however, he never missed work and he and Grandmother managed to raise their family. Grandmother was great with medicines she made from herbs, besides being a midwife in those early days. When there was a baby born, she would stay with the family and take care of everyone until the mother got on her feet. Those were the good old days, I guess, but that was my Grandma."

Harry Bell was a telegrapher with the Pennsylvania Railroad in the Burgettstown station and was known up and down the Panhandle Division as Shady.

He played a zither. Although he couldn't dance, he encouraged Amanda and the children to do square dancing or the shaddish. Ilene Learn recalls that he would hook up a surrey and drive to Cross Creek to a Cemetery, but it is not known who was buried there. Both he and Amanda are buried in the Burgettstown Presbyterian Cemetery.

This company took charge of affairs March 17, 1901. Since starting the company has become much scattered, but it is owned entirely by men who are members of labor societies.

One of his major projects was providing the plumbing and heating for Byberry, the Pennsylvania State Hospital for the Insane in northeast Philadelphia. He died of pneumonia while working on a project in Grafton, industrial heating system. Buried Elk View Cemetery, Clarksburg, West Virginia.
