Abraham Fulton and family settled in America in 1772 in the vicinity of Baltimore, Maryland.

SAMUEL FULTON

Samuel Fulton, son of Abraham, was born in Ireland in 1750. He enlisted in the Revolutionary War in 1776 in York County, Pa., served one year as Lieut. and five years as Capt. with the Pennsylvania troops. He was in the battles of Long Island, Brandywine, Staten Island, Hanging Rock, King's Mountain, Cowpens and Salisbury—as stated by A. H. Leavitt, Chief Veterans Section, Washington, D.C. He served till the end of the War, was wounded by gunshot in the knee which rendered him slightly lame for life, but he declined a pension, declaring: "I am amply compensated in the delivery of my country from British oppression".

After the War he resided for a short time in York County, Pa., where he married Catherine Smith, daughter of Colonel Smith, and shortly thereafter he and his wife set out on horseback with their few belongings, crossed the Allegheny Mountains and settled on a farm near Florence in Washington Co., Pa. They immediately joined the Cross Roads Presbyterian Church (Florence) of which Rev. Elisha McCurdy was pastor, and in 1803 Samuel was elected Ruling Elder. The following testimonial concerning him from the Records of the Presbytery of Washington reveals his sterling qualities: "He was a regular attendant at church and prayer meetings, cold or hot, rain or sunshine. He was liberal and prompt in both the spiritual and temporal affairs of the church, always paying his subscriptions and pew rent the day they were due. He was a strict observer of the Sabbath and always ceased work on the farm at three or four o'clock on Saturday to rest and prepare for the Sabbath, and on that day he never engaged in wordly conversation. He was a "living epistle known and read of all men" in the community where he lived. He died May 15, 1821 in the 71st year of his age, leaving a family of five sons and three daughters, all of whom were members of the church. He was buried in the graveyard adjacent to the Cross Roads Presbyterian Church. A marble slab marks his grave with this inscription:

In memory of
SAMUEL FULTON
who departed this life
May 15th, 1821
in the 71st year of his age.

"Let me die the death of the righteous and let my last end be like his."

Nearby is the tombstone of his daughter with this inscription:

In memory of
MARGARET FULTON
who departed this life
October 31st, 1824
in the 24th year of her age.

Inscription: "Remember, youth, as you pass by,
That I was young and had to die."

CATHERINE FULTON, wife of Samuel, was pensioned by special act of Congress, August 5th, 1848. She died March 11th, 1852, in the 91st year of her age.

THE FAMILY OF SAMUEL FULTON

Branch.

1. William Fulton married Mary Campell. Their descendants will be traced later.

2. David Fulton, first wife, Miss Dunlap, daughter of the third President of Washington College. Five children, viz., Samuel married Sarah McCurdy, daughter of Rev. Elisha McCurdy, minister of Florence Church: five children. 1. Sarah married Mr. Hedges. 2. Catherine married and removed to Oregon. James died early. David was a Photographer in Lancaster, Pa., he was the father of Robert Fulton of steamboat fame. David's second wife was Mary Kenister. Children: Smiley and Jane. Nothing further known.

3. Mary married Charles Campbell. Nothing further known. Probably related to Wm. Fulton's wife, Mary Campbell.

4. Samuel married Jane McClune and removed to Ashland, Ohio. Children: 1. John, lawyer, Ashland, died early leaving three children—Albert and Mary who became famous as Missionaries in China, and Herman, in business in Indianapolis. McClune in business in Reading, Pa.—Catherine and Maria, nothing further known.

5. John married Jane McCluskey. Three children: Catherine, who married Mr. Harriet; Robert became a minister and located in Cumberland. ○

6. Catherine married Mr. Arnold. Two sons: Samuel and Thomas.

7. Robert married Miss Caldwell, daughter of Pastor of Florence Church. Six children: Elisha married Sarah MacFarren, residence N.Y., eight children. Samuel, married Sophie Hooper, eight children. Robert married Elizabeth Milbone, lived in Montclair, N.J., four children. Sarah married Rev. W. T. Beatty, D.D., who died in Minneapolis, eight children—located in Westchester, Pa. Elizabeth married John Steen of Philadelphia, but died early.

8. Margaret died early—in 1824.

We now return to the descendants of William Fulton, the first born son of Samuel. He married Mary Campbell and settled on a farm near Hickory, Pa. They united with the Mt. Prospect Presbyterian Church where they were regular attendants as long as they lived.

William died April 10th, 1845, and his wife Mary died March 5th, 1851. They were buried in Mt. Prospect Cemetery. Their tombstones are inscribed:

“WILLIAM FULTON
died April 10th, 1845
in the 57th year of his age.

‘Let me die the death of the righteous, and let my last end be like his.’”

“MARY
Wife of William Fulton
died March 5th, 1851.

‘Blessed are the dead who die in the Lord from henceforth;
They rest from their labors and their works do follow them.’”

The descendants of William and Mary Fulton were:

10. Mary, married David Reed. Children: Margaret, Ruth.
11. Charles (2), college graduate, enlisted in Civil War, married Mary Kelly, farmer in Iowa. Children: Nettie, Charles.

We now return to the family history of David, **Branch 6** of the descendants of William Fulton and Mary Campbell.

Branch 6. David Fulton, born Jan. 27, 1820, married Nancy Mayhew, April 13, 1854, who was born April 27th, 1832. They lived on a farm near Hickory until 1858, then exchanged farms with Moses Lyle near Florence, where they resided until their death. They were members of the Presbyterian Church in Florence. THE MAYHEWS

Because the Mayhews are so frequently mentioned in this family history it is advisable to give a sketch of the Mayhew antecedents. Thomas Mayhew did not come to America in the "Mayflower" as stated by W. P. Fulton in his family history published in 1920. The following statement has been furnished by the Secretary of State of Massachusetts:

"Thomas Mayhew was born early in 1592. He was a merchant in Southampton, England: came to America in the "Griffin" in 1633; settled at Watertown, Mass.: removed to Marthas Vineyard in 1647 and began a settlement at Edgartown. He died

April 13, 1682. Another source says he died in 1681 at the age of 93 years." The "Mayhew Tree" claims he began the settlement at Edgartown in 1642, and was Governor and Patentee of Martha's Vineyard, Nantucket and Elizabeth Isles. Quoting again the Sec. of State: "In October, 1641, James Forrett, Agent of the Earl of Stirling, sold for 40 pounds to Thomas Mayhew and his son Thomas Mayhew, Jr., the Island of Nantucket and several small islands adjacent. On July 2, 1659, Thomas Mayhew deeded his rights to Nantucket to ten purchasers (giving their names) in consideration of thirty pounds, "and also two Beaver Hatts, one for myself and one for my wife".

Thomas Mayhew, Jr., engaged in Christian Missionary among the Indians and after his death, Thomas Mayhew, Sr., being acquainted with the Indian language, continued the missionary work until his death. Experience Mayhew, the great great grandson of Thomas, was an ordained minister and his son Jonathan born in 1720, graduated at Harvard in 1744, ordained Pastor of West Church Boston in 1747, was a brilliant preacher and writer, dying at the age of 46. Thus for over 130 years the Mayhews contributed a wholesome moral and educational influence in the early history of Massachusetts.

The line of descent of our Branch of the Mayhews is as follows: Thomas Senior, Thomas Junior, Matthew, Pain, Thomas, Pain, Wilmot, Truman, Truman, John, who was the father of our mother Nancy, who married David Campbell Fulton.

The Mayhews removed from Northumberland County, Pa., to Washington County, Pa., in the year 1821, and settled near Florence. The following incident in the life of our grandfather, John Mayhew, should be recorded: As a young man one harvest day he and others ran a fast race to the harvest field. The old fashioned harvest "cradle" had been left on its back with the scythe pointing upward. Shoes in those days were only for Sunday use, and at the end of the race John stepped squarely on the scythe and severed his foot more than half way through. It kept bleeding profusely until near midnight, when messengers went to the home of a reputed "witch" for help. When she was awakened and told of the accident, she turned in bed with her face to the wall, muttered a few words, then said: "All's done that can be done". Strangely enough the bleeding stopped at that hour. I heard my mother mention this incident often. In my boyhood days Matt Conn, the son of that reputed witch, did some work for my father and I was driving him home. He was an old man and I mentioned to him the accident to my grandfather's foot. He replied: "They called my mother a 'witch', but she was a good woman". I do not understand this: you explain it.

John Mayhew was born November 8, 1798, and married Elizabeth Jackson (born December 9, 1800), February 21, 1822. Soon thereafter they located on a farm at Fairview, West Va., where they lived until their death. Of this union eleven children were born: Rebecca, May 31, 1824; Eliza Ann, April 3, 1826; James N., December 31, 1827; Polly, February 11, 1830; Nancy, April 27, 1832; David Simeon, August 31, 1834; John Wesley, July 25, 1836; Mary, April 1, 1838; Lydia Elizabeth, February 18, 1840; William V., June 27, 1842; George, March 6, 1845.

John Mayhew served as Squire in the community respected by all people for his sterling qualities. He died April 12, 1881 at the age of 83. His wife died November 10, 1875, at the age of 75. They were both members of the Methodist Church.
