List of Negro and mulatto children registered under the act of assembly, passed March 29, 1788, to amend the act of 1780 for the gradual abolition of slavery in Pennsylvania. This required the registration of all Negro and mulatto children born after March 1, 1780.

The first registered under this act was a female mulatto child, named Hester aged two years, Registered by David Bradford, of Washington, on July 22, 1788.

From this time we find the entries rather frequent until ~~March 28~~ April 29, 1820, when Thomas Brice, merchant, of Washington, entered a "female mulatto child named Jane Ann Clark born on the 3d day of April 1820 of the body of Betsy a slave until 28 years."

During this period of 38 years we find the following entries:
