The swish or scourges upon naked flesh, the spatter of blood, the demoniacal cries of the mob of fanatic, and murderers, the sound of the crun hing of nails driven powerfully int; human flesh and sinews, the inhu nan shout of triumph when their Victim was nailed to His cross, the crude, coarse jesting, the blasphemou; banter, all the unknown, incredil le cruelty of an Oriental mob-it 's enough to make the heart stand still with horror.

But we have no right to shrink from witnessing the tragedy of Calvary. If we know not Calvary, we know not Christ. We dare not, like cowardly Christians, omit the cross from our Christianity. God forbid we should glory except in the cross of Christ.
