R. W. Grand Master 1868 - 1869

RICHARD VAUX - 1816 - 1895

Born in Philadelphia, Pa., in 1816 of the Episcopal faith, his parents were both distinctive and influential in their community. His father, Robert Vaux, was in public office and a law maker.

Six months before he was 21 years of age, Richard Vaux was admitted to practice at the legal bar and was sent to London with private letters from President Van Buren. He was made the Secretary of the American Legation for two years. He later returned to Philadelphia and served as Recorder for that city for seven

years without pay.

In 1842, at the age of 26, he was initiated into Freemasonary. It is claimed that Brother Vaux was made a "Mason at Sight." He received his Fellow Craft Mason's Degree and Master Mason's Degree in Lodge No. 3, held at Philadelphia, in January and February 1843. He resigned from Lodge No. 3 in January 1844 and petitioned Union Lodge, No. 121, held at Philadelphia, for membership. He was elected Senior Warden of Union Lodge, No. 121, the same year and in 1845 served as its Worshipful Master. Later he was elected Treasurer, an office he held for many years.

In 1856, Brother Vaux was elected Mayor of Philadelphia. Always active in the Grand Lodge, he was elected Junior Grand Warden in 1862. Elected to terms as Senior Grand Warden and Deputy Grand Master, he was elected and installed Right Worshipful Grand Master of Masons in Pennsylvania for the years 1868 and 1869. As Grand Master he presided at the cornerstone ceremonies of the Masonic Temple, Philadelphia, on June 24,

1868.

Brother Richard Vaux died on March 22, 1895 at age 79.

At his death, The Legal Intelligencer printed the following

eulogy:

"Mr. Vaux loved his country, his state, his city his profession and his fellow man. Bold to fearlessness, he was wise and prudent in council and tolerated only the highest tone in thought and action. Those who knew him best, loved him best,"

THE HISTORY

RICHARD VAUX LODGE, No. 454 - F. & A. M.

In 1869, Brother James C. Acheson, District Deputy Grand Master, communicated with Brother Richard Vaux, Right Worshipful Grand Master, and received authorization to Constitute a new Lodge to be held in the Village of Burgettstown, Washington County, Pennsylvania.

The Warrant of Constitution was dated December 1, 1869, and was issued to Richard Vaux Lodge, No. 454. It authorized either Brother Acheson or Brother Alfred C. Creigh, Past Master of Washington Lodge, No. 164, "to open and constitute the new Lodge

and install the proper Officers."

Brother Creigh later reported that he "did open and constitute the Lodge called Richard Vaux Lodge, No. 454, and install the Officers thereof, according to ancient usage and form," on January 21, 1870.

There were ten Warrant Members, as follows:

Brother George T. McCord, Worshipful Master, from Chartiers

Lodge, No. 297.

Brother John. B. Hayes, Senior Warden, from St. John's Lodge, Pittsburgh.

Brother Robert T. C. Stephenson, Junior Warden, from Wash-

ington Lodge, No. 164.

Brother William Marshall, Brother William Cole and Bro-

ther Alfred C. Stephenson of Washington Lodge, No. 164.

Brother John C. Reed, Brother Pressley Henwood and Brother William O. Stevenson from Chartiers Lodge, No. 297. Brother Jesse Kemp, whose original Lodge in West Virginia was not known at the time.

The original Dues of the Lodge were set at three dollars per year. The fee for conferring the three Degrees was thirty dollars.

The first Lodge Room was in a building located at Railroad Street and McClure Avenue. The original minute book was destroyed when this building was damaged by fire.

In 1887 a Mason Hall Association was formed and stock was sold. The Lodge Hall was established in the National Bank Building on the corner of North Main Street in 1902. At a later date the Lodge Hall was moved to another building called the Haines

Building, where our Lodge has met for many years.

In addition to the ten Warrant Members, 43 Members were initiated during our first year. There were 21 new Members initiated in 1871, our second year, and only seven new Members taken in during 1872. Only five Members were initiated from 1880 through 1888. Twelve Members were initiated in 1889. By 1897 our Lodge had initiated 181 Members. However, 54 had resigned, 45 had been suspended and 14 Members died. Of the 53 Members in our Lodge in 1897, only two of the ten Warrent Members remained.

In 1920 our Lodge celebrated its Fiftieth Anniversary. Brother James O. Fredricks was Worshipful Master and he has long been remembered for his devotion to Richard Vaux Lodge and his more than sixty years of activity in the Ritualistic and Lodge Work. During our Fiftieth Anniversary year the Lodge initiated 56 new Members, holding meetings in each of the twelve months. At the end of that year our Membership totaled 242

The Richard Vaux Mason Hall Association was incorporated in December 1968 for the purpose of purchasing a building or having a new Masonic Hall built. The following were elected Directors of this Association: Brother Rocco Boni, Past Master, President; Brother Charles Cunningham, Vice President; Brother James C. Wolfe, Past Master, Treasurer; Brother George P. Trenary, Past Master, Secretary; Brother Glenn E. Newman, Brother Harry L. Lee, Brother Ross Krumme, Brother Robert C. Cassidy, Jr., and Brother William Pappas.

The Brethren of Richard Vaux Lodge, No. 454, look proudly and with great esteem at the high goals achieved by many of our

Members in professions, in business and in politics.

With grateful hearts and fraternal respect for the Brethren who have made the first one hundred years of our Lodge possible, we now look forward with equal dedication and determination to the best interests of Richard Vaux Lodge, No. 454, in particular, and to the cause of Freemasonry in general.
