A sum of \$500 has been set aside for germicidal lights and \$16.83 has been allocated to a canteen fund.

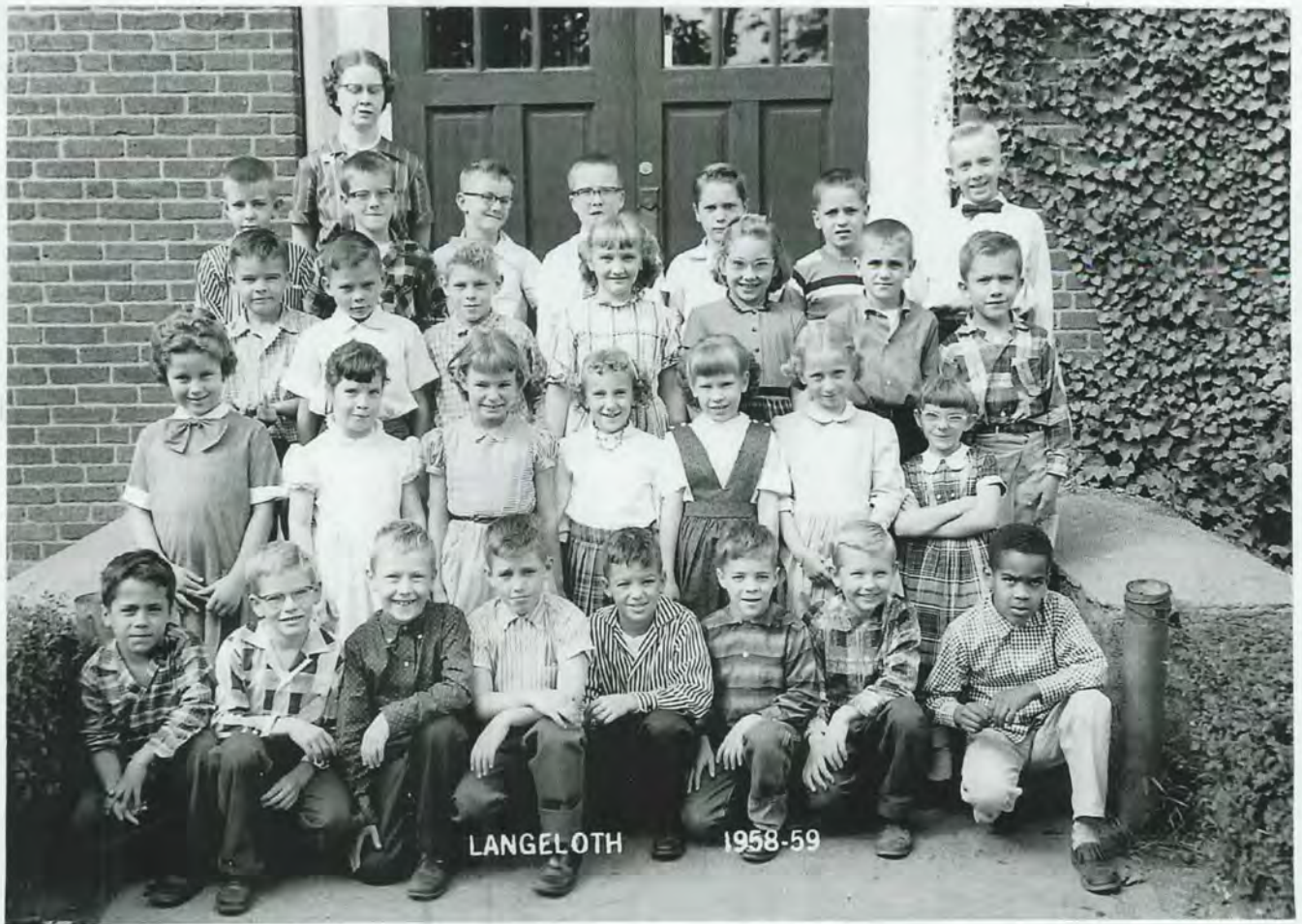

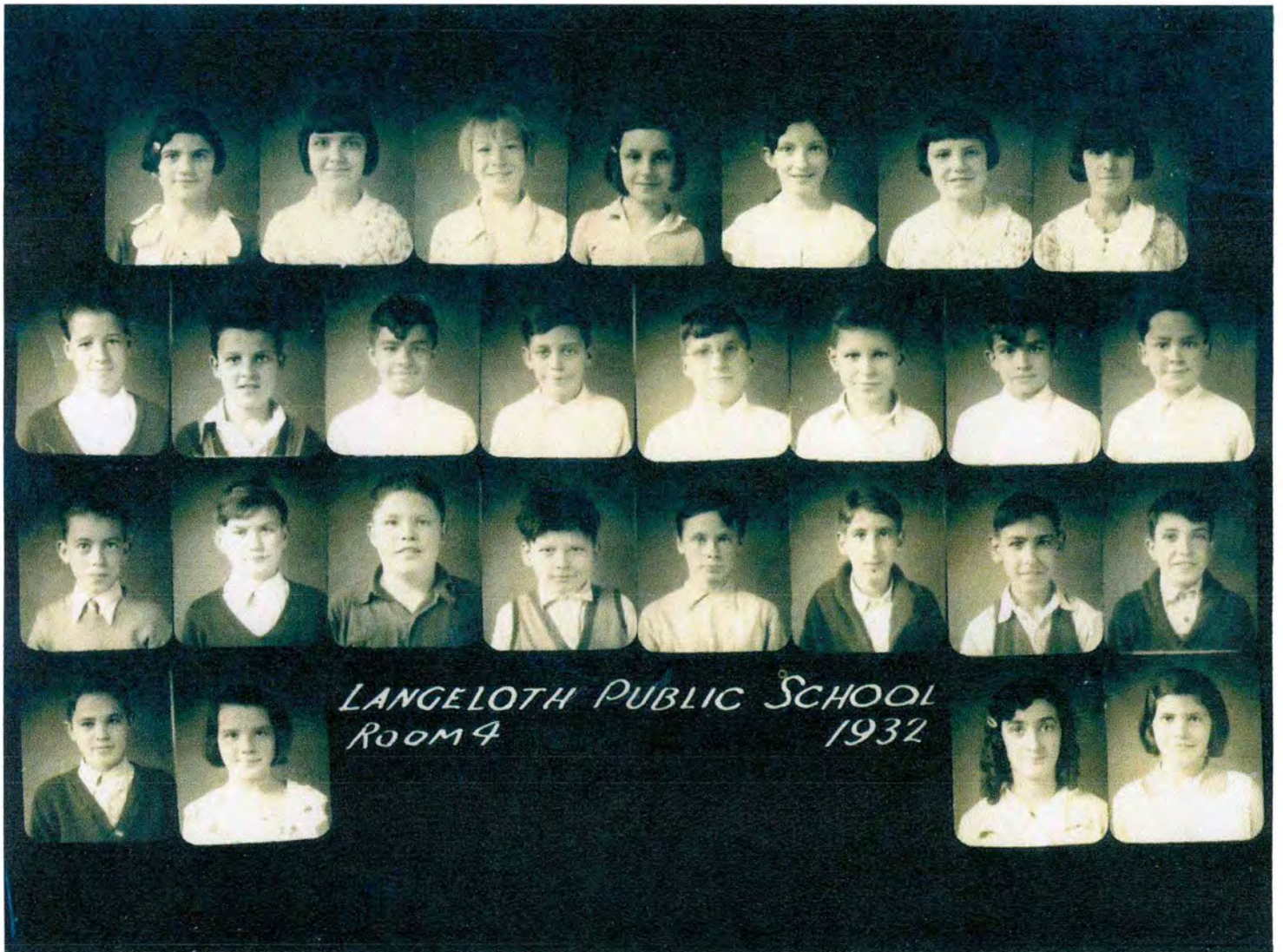
