Avella Is 2 to 1 Victor Over Langeloth In Soccer Playoff

Dave Richardson's speedy Avella eleven had their hands full with an aggressive and determined Langeloth club in wrestling out a 2-1 verdict before an estimated 650

fans in Hill Stadium last Monday night, under the lights.

The opening whistle saw both clubs starting at full speed, and that's how it ended, as these finely groomed and evenly matched elevens battled for the right to compete with Molleneaur for the Section 1 title.

Avella controlled the leather throughout most of the first period, with play between Langeloths 30 and 40 yard lines. They would work the ball down but couldn't penetrate the stonewall defense that was thrown against them. Resorting to long shots, they saw Goalie Peanuts Montequin smother 4 of their scoring opportunities. Twice in this period, Langeloth sent the ball goalward but Nagy saved.

The second half saw the torrid tempo stepped up even faster and the play even more grueling. With 15 minutes of the period gone, Beanie Gonzales, the Dutch Montequin's clubs' center came up to make a block on the ball and collapsed in pain. Examination showed that his leg was broken in two places. With Beanie and his sensational playing lost, Langeloth had to finish under a terrific handicap.

At the 29 minute mark, Gardner of Avella was awarded a foul shot from the 40 yard line. He rifled a kick goalward and the ball went straight for the cage on a line. It hit the bottom of the crosspiece, bounced off of Montequin's nape of the neck and into the net to put Avella out front, 1-0.

Four minutes later, Langeloth's brilliant Pin Gonzales knotted the count from six yards out. Getting the ball on the 18, Pin outslicked four Avella men and set up a shot from a very difficult angle. His

toe was true, and the count read, 1-1.

Fratoni scored the winning goal for Avella at the 38 minute mark, at 3 yards out. During a scramble for the ball directly in front of the Langeloth cage, Fratoni wedged his kicking foot in between several players' feet, and tapped the ball past Montequin and into the net.

The winners had 13 fouls called against them, with nine coming in the second half. Their goalie had 3 saves and had 4 corner kicks directed at him. Langeloth was charged with 15 fouls, with 10 coming in the half. Montequin had 5 saves and had 4 corner kicks in his direction.

Picking the most outstanding players of each club would almost be an impossibility, as each contestant contributed a brilliant job in his club's behalf. The field was full of stars in this battle between two traditional rivals. Avella's Pascuzzi let the heat of the fray get the best of him midway in the second canto and he was banished for unsportsmanship conduct.
