armicle 1st. The Presiöcnt shall appoint two or more Marshals, whoshall superintend the Exbibition and see that all Stock sud other articless. are put in the places designed for them; and who shall preserve order daring the Fair.
ARI. 2D. One or more members of the Board, to be appointed of the President, will attend eack Committee on viewirg Sticek or the artieles on Exhibition; and shomidany vacancy or vacancies occur in any Committee, will appoint suitable persens to fill the same.
ART. 3D. No persoe will be permitted to exbibit Steces, (for promium.) of which he is not the owner, or any article, unless, be is the manufazturer, inveator or ixporter thereof.
Arr. Aran No premium fill be awaded for axy animal or articio, waless the fudges deem the same worthy of it.
Axt. biac. No animal will be permitted to compete in more than cae class at the same Fair.
Arx. Gra. Persons entering Field crops are required to have the groand correctly surveged, and the product accurately measured, by two disinterested perions, ond certificates thereof mita the mode of cultivation, handed to the Secretary.
Anc. isg. All stock, and other articies intended for exbibition, must be eatered and numberod, before noon of the day on which they are exbibited; but no stooid can be entered antil the person entexing the sume shall satisfy the Secretary that he is a member of the Society, and has paid the aunual fee requiped by the Constitation.
Arr. Exy No person shall serve on any awarding committee who has any axticle or stock before the same, and in case the remaning members canuat agsee, they may select some other suitable person to act with them tor the time being.
Ans. 9xar. When stocir is entered for exhibin tion the owner will place in the bands of the Se cretary the age and pedigree so far as known: but Committees will give their awards. to the best animais.
Ans. 16ras. Competition will be open to all persons, who may become exhibitors, on the payment of the same fee that is paid by regnatar members.

Art. Tlue No wagrons or carriages will be. permitted to remain on the Fair Grounds except such as are eatered for eshibition or intended to be used in the xing, and all such used for briuging stock or other articles intended for ezaibition, shall leaye the enclosnse when directed by the Marshais so to do, and a suitable place will be assigned them adjaceat to the grounds.
Whe owner of any stock or article on expibition, who shall remove the ssme before $30^{\circ}$ citock, af the second day of the Fair, will forfeit any premiums to which he sould have been entitied.
