Cooper and Mame V. Cooper, the subscribing witnesses to said paper writing, and it appearing to said clerk that all the parties interested in said proceeding have had due notice thereof and that said clerk being satisfied from said evidence that said paper writing is the true last Will and testament of said Robert Brice, deceased, and it appearing from said evidence that at the time of the execution thereof, that said Robert Brice was of sound mind and disposing memory, it is accordingly ordered by said clerk, that said paper writing be and is hereby admitted to probate and record as and for the true last will and testament of said Robert Brice, deceased. And thereupon Jesse S. Brice, who is named in said paper writing as executor thereof, qualified as such executor,

and together with Anna Bruce and Wm. S. Cooper, entered into a bond in the penalty of One Thousand Dollars (\$1000.00) conditioned according to law, which said bond is hereby approved.

Bruce all my estate, real personal and mixed, wheresoever situate of, which I may die seized, my real estate consisting of the farm on which I now reside, situate on the waters of Kings Creek, in the District, County and State aforesaid, containing 223 acres, more or less, subject, however to the following bequests, to-wit =

Third = I will and direct that my said nephew, Jesse G. Bruce shall pay to my sister Jane Palston, the sum of One Hundred Dollars.

Fourth = I will and direct that my said nephew Jesse G. Bruce shall pay to my two nieces Annie Bruce and Emma Bruce the sum of four hundred dollars each.

Fifth = I will and direct that my said nephew, Jesse G. Bruce shall pay the several bequests hereinbefore mentioned in this, my last will and testament, within two years from the date of my death, without interest.

I do hereby nominate and appoint my nephew, Jesse G. Bruce, Executor of this my Last Will and Testament.

come over. Many English, however, had large estates and land bestowed on them.

In the year 1615, an Irish parliament and convocation were summoned to meet, when such laws were enacted as such regulations made, as rendered secure the possessions of the colonists. All the sees were filled with protestant bishops and instead of adopting the articles of the Church of England, which some wished, Archbishop Ussher was requested to draw up a set of articles; which gave entire satisfaction to the parliament, and to both houses of convocation. The confession is, in its main features, as decidedly Calvinistic as that of the Westminster Assembly; and includes, in nearly the very same words, the nine Lambeth articles, which the Puritans strove, in 1604, at the Hampton Court conference, to have introduced. No power of instituting ceremonies in religion was granted; and a conformity to the doctrines laid down was the only term of communion. In consequence of the adoption of this sound and liberal system, for the Irish Church, many ministers removed to Ulster.

The first colonists, both from England and Scotland were not of the most religious and orderly of the people but generally adventurers, and such as fled from debt, or who wished to mend their broken fortunes. Even the Scottish people, who flocked in great numbers to Down, Antrim, Londonderry, &c., are represented to have been an irreligious people, who seemed to engage in this enterprise rather to fly from God, than to follow their own mercy. But God followed them when they fled from Him. For awhile, indeed, ignorance and vice prevailed in a awful degree among the colonists; but the mercy, by which God, in his providence, followed them, was the arrival among them of a band of faithful ministers, whose labours were remarkably blessed to the conversion of many souls of this irreligious multitude. Of these, the first, in the

order of time, was the Rev. Edward Brice, M. A., who had for many years been a settled minister in Stirlingshire : but being persecuted in his own country, he was finally obliged to fly, and passed over into Ireland, where among the colonists he had some friends, especially the Rev. William Edmonstone, who had once been his neighbour, in Scotland. Mr. Brice, after being in Ireland some time, was promoted by the bishop of the diocese, to be prebendary of Kilroot, which was an honour more nominal than real. He here had an opportunity of preaching the gospel without re-

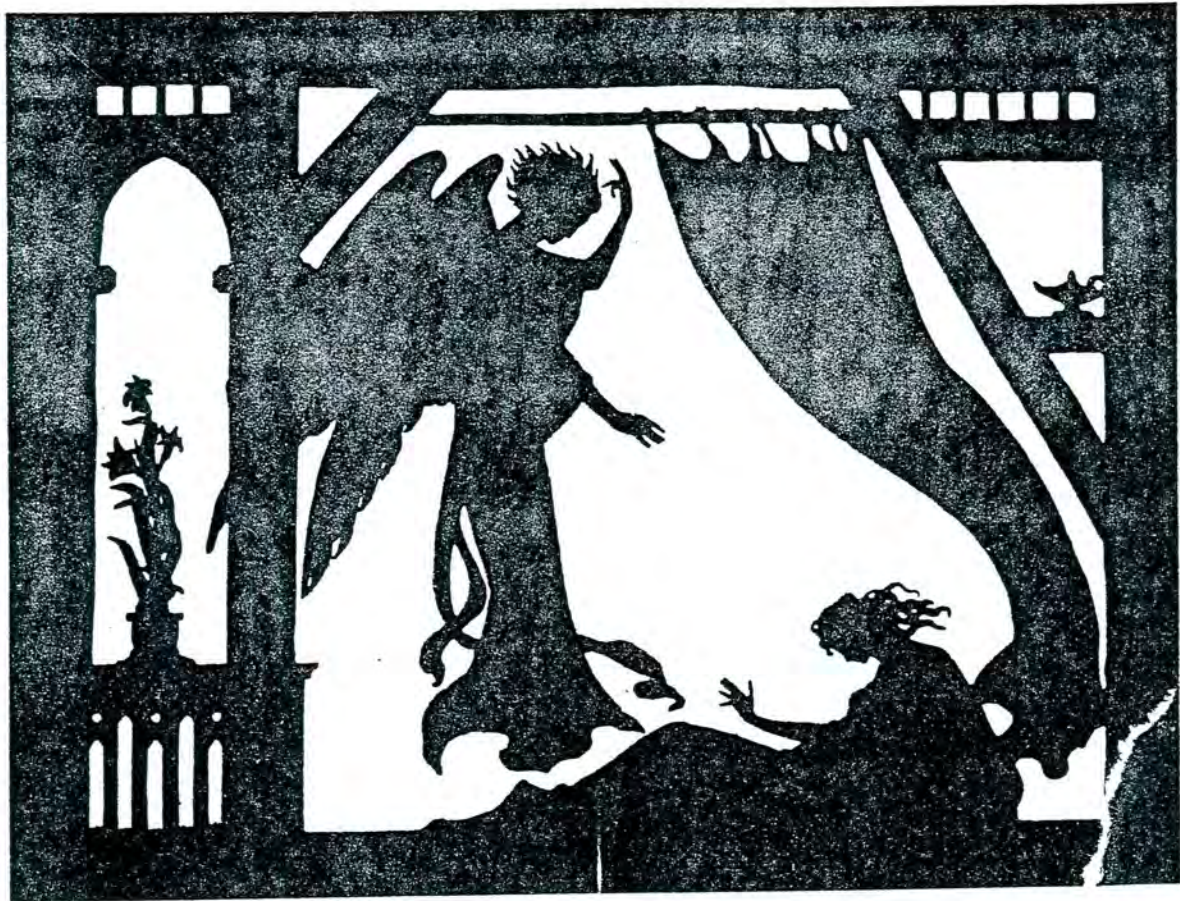

IRVINE Died at his residence, in Smithfield, Tuesday morning, Oct. 15, 1878, at 2 o'clock, JOHN IRVINE, aged about 72 years....was well known throughout the entire county. He was born in the county of Donegal, Ireland, in the year 1806, and emigrated to this country in 1819, being thirteen years of age. He came direct to Steubenville, where he remained about five years, learning the wheelright trade with a man by the name of Nath. In 1824 he removed to Smithfield, where he continued to live until his decease. He was married in 1825 when but 19 years of age to Miss Rebecca LeMasters, who who was born and raised in Jefferson county, but a few miles from Smithfield, and who still survives him. They joureyed through life together for over 53 years. They have had three children, one son and two daughters who are all still living.

Mr. Irvine was for several years Postmaster at Smithfield during the administration of Martin Vanburen we believe, and was also for many years the Mayor of Smithfield. He was also Justice of the Peace for a long period such being his popularity that he could beat all competitors. ...He was also for many years Notary Public. Mr. Irvine was very much respected by his neighbors, and his funeral was largely attended. He was connected with the Masonic fraternity twenty-seven years and was buried by the Smithfield Lodge, with which he first connected himself. T. B. Coulter, assisted by William Hamilton, conducted the services according to the Masonic Ritual at the grave, and the Rev. Meeks of the Methodist Church of Smithfield, conducted the religious services at the home of the deceased. The pall bearers were Samuel King, Abraham C. Noble, Charles Burris, John N. Sutherland, John Logan, Wm. Armstrong, John Moore and Alexander Smith, of Smithfield Lodge.....

Mr. Jennings was born in this county near what is known as the Two Ridge meeting house, on the road leading from Steubenville to Richmond, July 14th, 1826. He has been a resident of this city from his childhood and for many years followed the river as mate, but for a number of years previous to his last sickness he followed butchering. He leaves an aged mother, a wife and eight children to mourn his death. His funeral took place Tuesday from his late residence.....

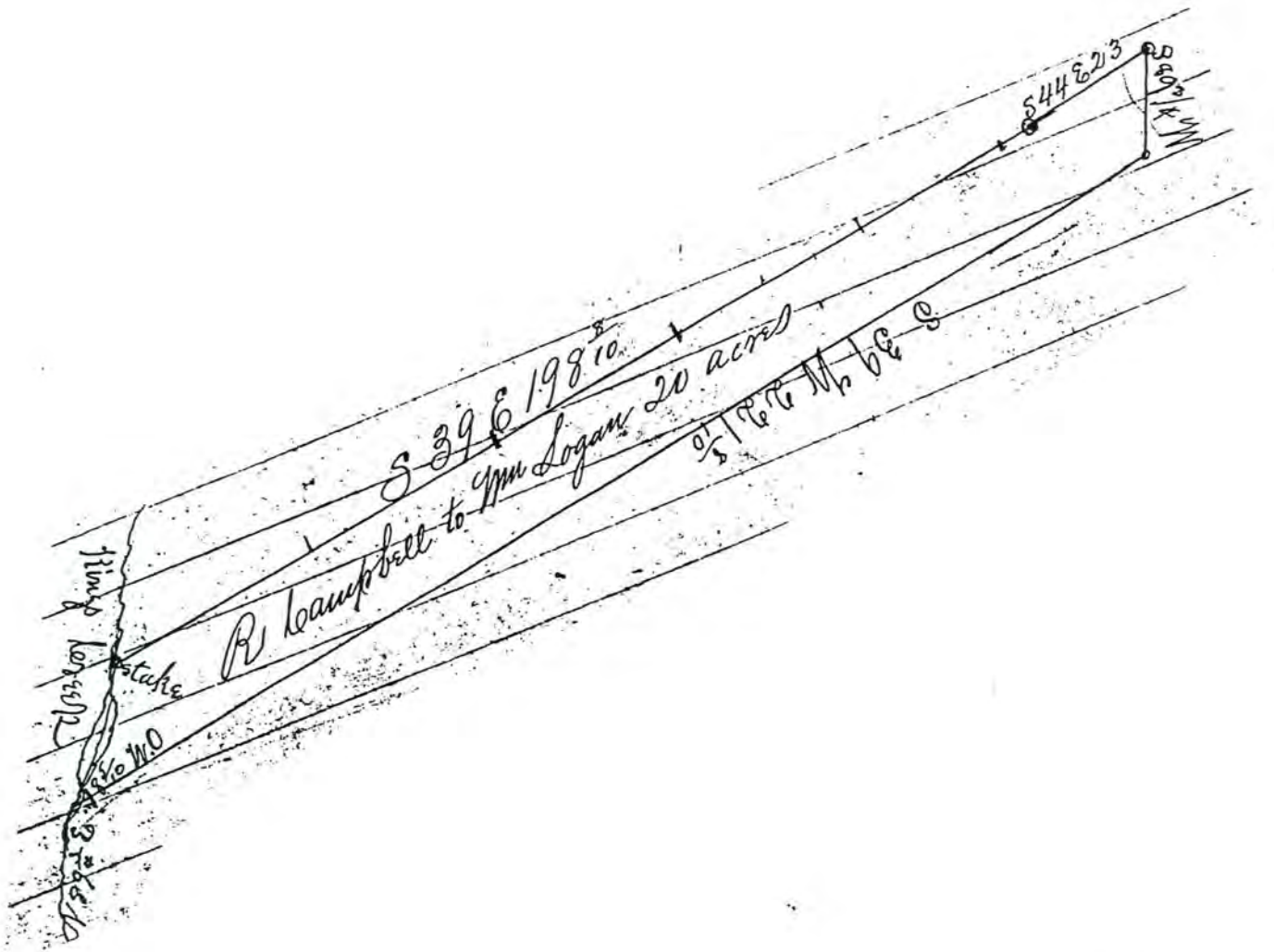

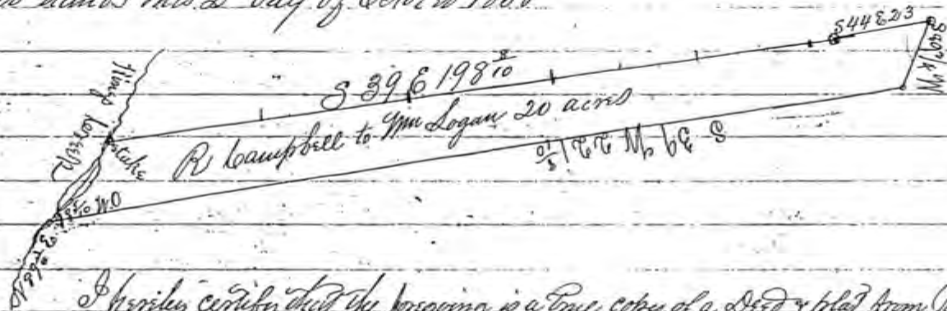
