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THE WOLF FAMILY OF WASHINGTON COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA  
(in German WOLFF - some American branches use WOLFE)

From Eastern Pennsylvania

In 1789 five Wolf brothers, sons of Peter Sr, were living in Washington County - about 5 miles west of Washington, Pennsylvania. They had come from the Swatara Creek region of what was then Hanover Township, Lancaster County, now East Hanover Township, Dauphin County - about 3 miles north of Hershey. Their names were Jacob, Peter, John, Christian (Christly), William. All but John were living in Donegal (now Buffalo) Township in 1789. John was in adjoining Strabane (now Canton) Township. Three brothers-in-law also lived in (now) Buffalo. This area was administered by Ohio County, Virginia before 1781. Tax lists for Ohio County are available for 1778. From tax records and census data the following are given:

The Dauphin County origin is given by:

- 1) William's pension application, S24020;
- 2) Beers' COMMEMORATIVE BIOGRAPHICAL RECORD OF WASHINGTON CO, p 698;
- 3) a statement by John's grandson, Crumrine papers, W & J College;
- 4) the William Darby account, below.

Beers says that Peter Sr came from the banks of the Rhine before 1755 and went from (then) Lancaster County to (now) Washington County about 1775, dying at an advanced age. The only record of Peter Sr in Washington County may be the "Wolf estate" in the 1789 tax lists. If this refers to Peter Sr, he died about 1788 at age 74.

The last listing of Jacob in Dauphin County is in the 1771 tax list. Peter Jr is listed in 1772. It looks as if Jacob and others came west about 1773. From the shape of the Wolf and Stricker farms (see below) it looks as if the Wolf farm was staked out first. Lawrence in his Virginia certificate said he settled in 1773. His last listing in Lancaster County was 1772.

William in his 1832 pension application said that he went to Washington County in the spring of 1776. He was the youngest son and likely migrated with his father, Peter Sr. Peter Sr sold his Lancaster County farm in April 1775. John Wolf came west about 1787.

Jacob Wolf was well-known in 1778, when at 34 he was named lieutenant in the Ohio County militia. He had built a fort about 1777. The court records of Ohio County list Jacob and Christian in 1778 in a land dispute with McBride. Stricker's name appears too. Records in the Colonel David Shepherd papers 1SS-5SS in the DRAPER MANUSCRIPTS (State Historical Society of Wisconsin) list:

William Wolf as a young man in the militia (1778) in Captain David Williamson's company

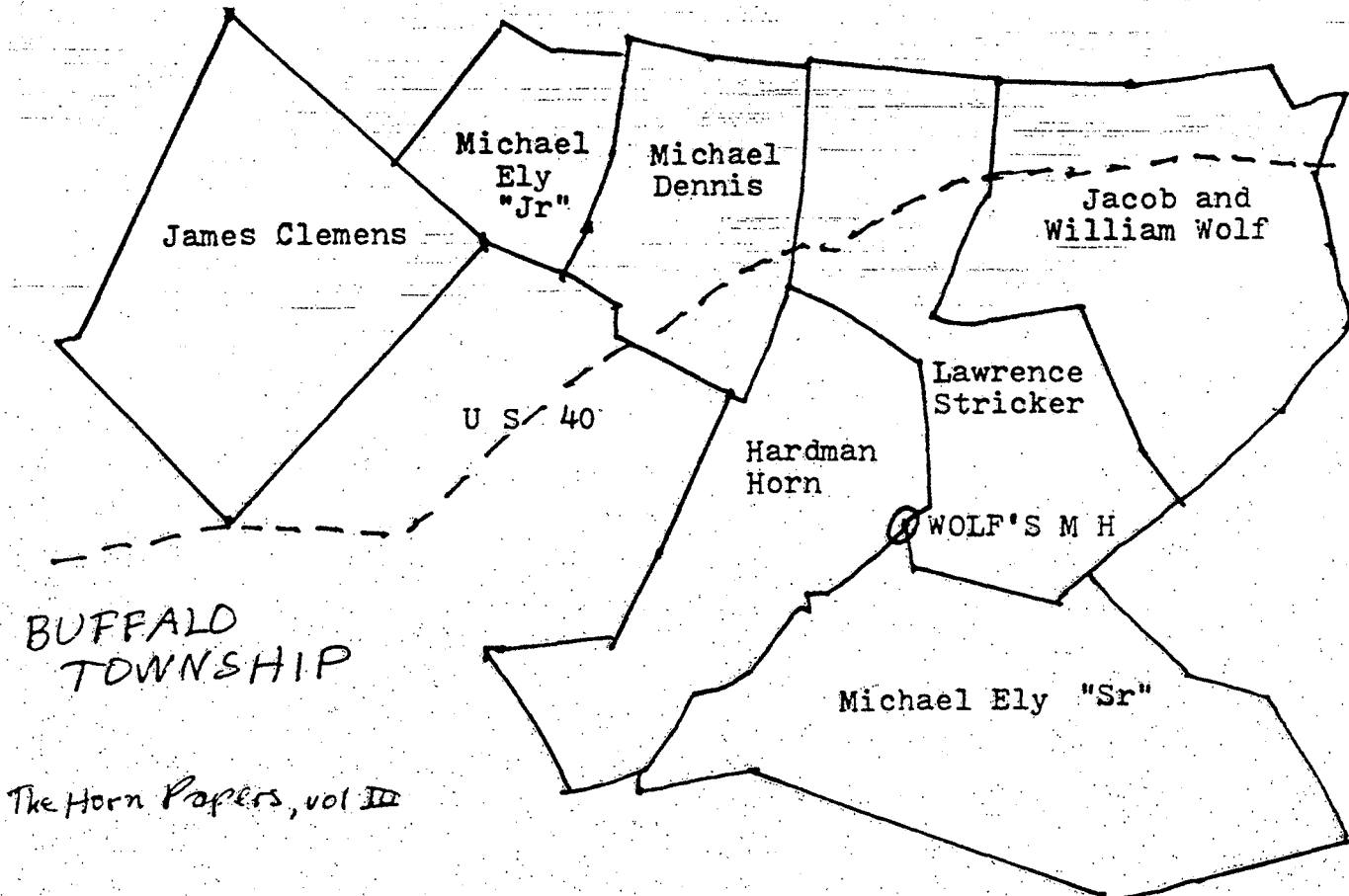
Jacob, Peter, Christian Wolf and Lawrence Stricker, Michael Dennis, Michael Ely are tithables (taxables) in Ohio County 1778.

In 1779 in District 8 are the 3 Wolf brothers; in District 9 Stricker, Dennis, Ely.

All except Jacob Wolf, a lieutenant, were assessed with fines 1778-79 for failure to appear at muster.

Peter Wolf Sr is not in any of the above lists. By 1815 Peter and Christian Wolf and Michael Ely "Jr" were in Ohio.

A map of the early farm lines is shown:



In the call given to Rev. Joseph Smith by the congregations of Buffalo and Cross Creek - Presbyterian - on June 21-1779 are the signatures of four Wolf brothers and Stricker and Ely. Thirty of the 202 names are from what was Donegal Township in 1781. (W. Pa. Gen. Socy. Quart. 8, 43, 1981) Listed together are these names:

Peter Wolf Sr

The record of the Peter Wolf Sr family was found by Annette K Burtger in the unpublished Moravian records at Bethlehem, Pennsylvania:

This Moravian church was a few miles east of the Wolf home. It is fortunate that this record has been preserved, because Peter Wolf Sr's Bible was burned when his cabin burned. Did the Indians do it? The birthplace of Hannah has not been found on a map. When Stoever married Peter Wolf and Hannah Wolf in 1742, they were both of Tulpehocken. Peter gradually moved west until he got to East Hanover.

Gangloff, Germany is about 5 km south of Meisenheim. See map. Meisenheim is on the Glan river and is located in Rheinland-Pfalz. Yoder in his PENNSYLVANIA GERMAN IMMIGRANTS (p 302) lists a Peter Wolf leaving Reifenbach in 1739 (landing at Philadelphia Sep 3-1739) and John, 23, leaving Gangloff in 1740 (landing Nov 25-1740). PENNSYLVANIA GERMAN PIONEERS I, 282-283 lists in the 1740 group JOHANNES WOLFF, 23, JOHANN PETER WOLFF, 25, JOHANN JACOB WOLFF, 20. These were likely brothers. This is Peter Sr who went to East Hanover. Also on the 1740 boat were: Adam Maurer, 32, of Becherbach; Joseph Kuchler, 24, of Callbach; Abraham Haass, 27, of Medard; Leonard Gerhard, 43, of Lettweiler. These men all belonged to Oberamt Meisenheim, Duchy of Zweibrücken.

Peter Wolf Sr may be the Peter taxed in 1750 with Jacob in Lebanon Township. He is likely the Peter, taxed in Lebanon in 1759, having fled from Hanover because of Indian attacks. This is the record of Peter Sr:

Peter Wolf Sr was a member of Hill (Lutheran) Church (Lebanon Co) in 1744. His son, John was baptized there March 31-1747.

The 1768 tract of Peter lay northeast of the junction of Bow and Swatara creeks. The adjoinees are shown. This is 3 miles north of present Hershey - the chocolate town.



This land was sold Apr 27-1775 by Peter and Hannah Wolf to Abraham Hurst for £ 700. The deed was recorded July 13. Witnesses were John Thomas and Peter Hurst. Jacob Sauter was a witness to the receipt. The deed was acknowledged May 10. William Darby, see below, was born in 1775 on the adjoining Dixon tract. In 1756 Wolf, Dixon, Wilson and Thompson were all on the tax list. After selling the farm Peter Wolf Sr likely moved to Washington County to be with his children there.

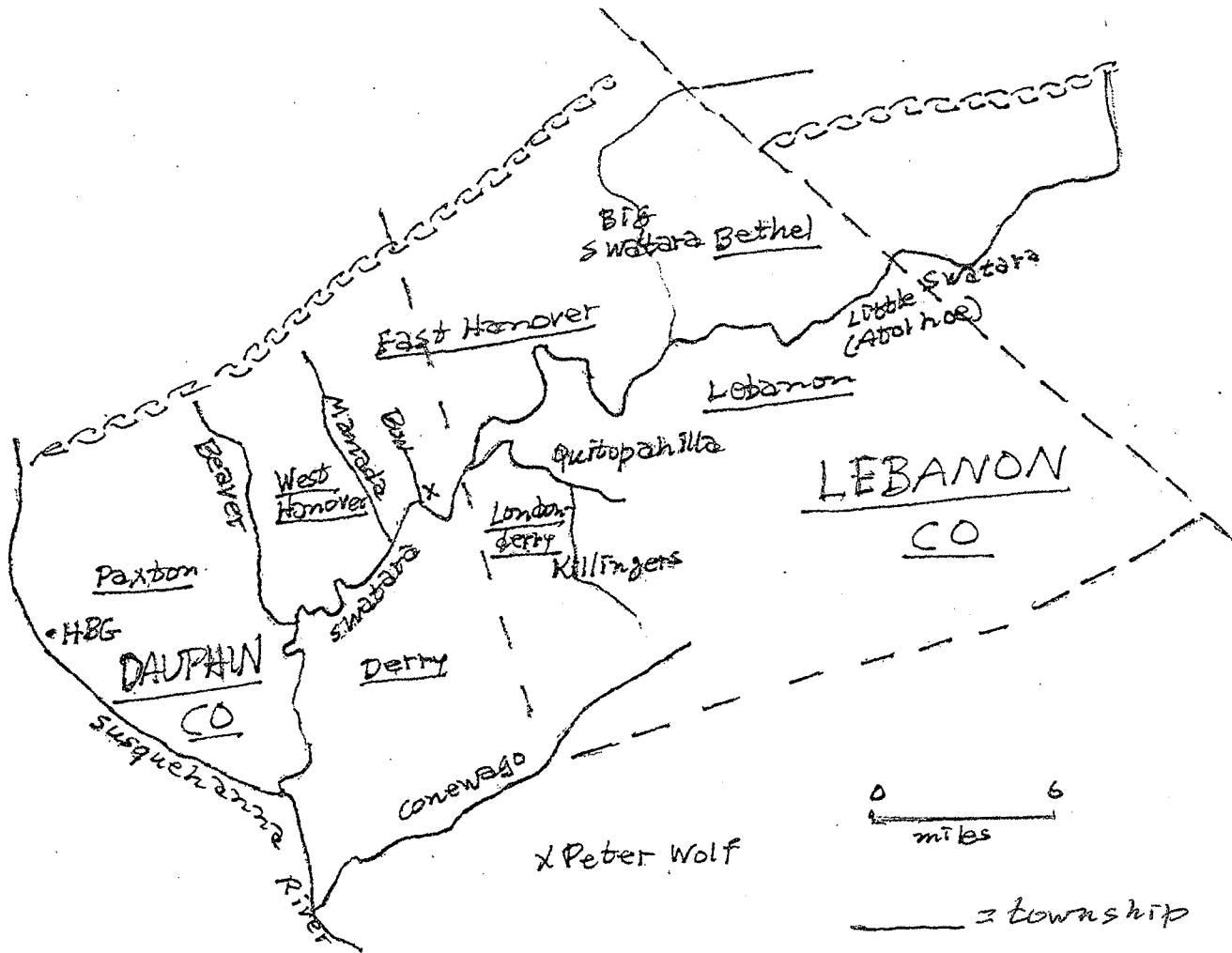
Jacob and Peter Jr, the oldest sons, were taxed in East Hanover in 1770 and 1771 as tenants. They were listed with Lawrence Stricker. In 1772 Peter Jr was listed again, but not Jacob. Stricker was taxed for one cow in 1772 in adjoining Londonderry Township. (Another Jacob Wolf in Hanover may have been the brother of Peter Sr.)

In February 1771 Jacob and Elizabeth Wolf were sponsors at the baptism by J. Casper Stoever (Lutheran minister who married Peter Sr) of (Johann) Wilhelm Stricker, son of Lawrence and Barbara (Wolf) Stricker of Hanover. (Egle's NOTES AND QUERIES, A V 1896)

Dennis, Ely, Stricker

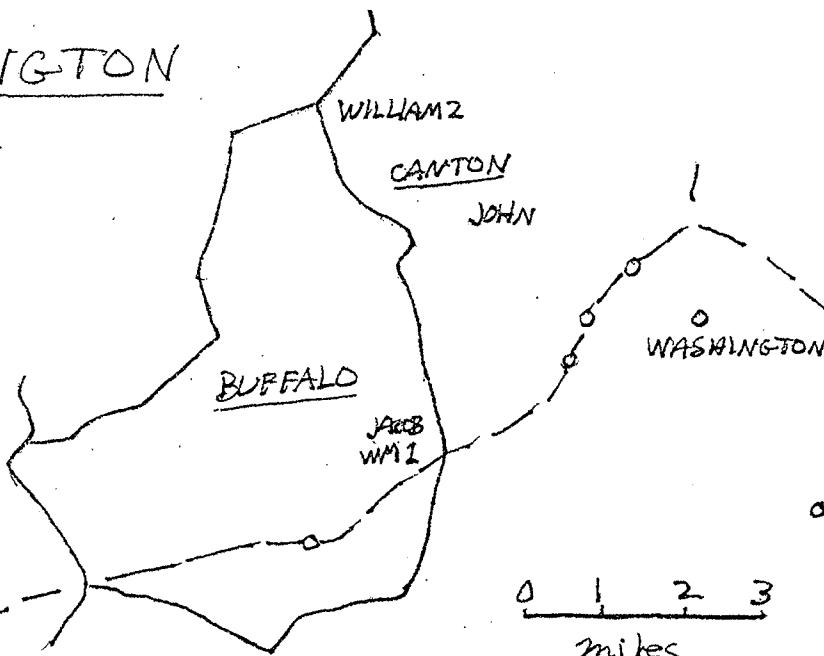
Three of the German families who lived near Jacob Wolf in Washington County were from the Hanover region. Michael Dennis (Dinges) was likely a son of Philip. Philip Denni(u)s of Lebanon Township was naturalized the same day as Peter Wolf Sr. Michael Ely "Sr" (Ili) was taxed in Londonderry Township, just south of Hanover, 1779-82. His children were baptized at Bindnagle Church. A Martin Ely (Illy) was associated with Peter and Jacob Wolf in Lebanon Township in the 1750s. Michael Ely "Jr" certainly came from the same region. Lawrence Stricker was a Wolf neighbor in Hanover and in Buffalo Township, Washington County. Stricker, Ely "Jr" and Dennis married daughters of Peter Wolf.

LAWRENCE STRICKER signed his name on an 1804 road petition as Johann Lorentz Stricker. In 1747 a Johann Lorentz Stracker landed at Philadelphia with Martin "Strecker". His signature is similar to that

in 1804. In 1764 Johann Lorentz Stricker was a witness to a deed in Paxton Township, then Lancaster County. His father, William, died in Paxton in 1767. This may be the William who landed at Philadelphia Sep 26-1752. Whether Lawrence of Buffalo came in 1747 or in 1752 with his father is not known.

Lawrence was taxed in East Hanover Township, now Dauphin County in 1770 and 1771 with Jacob and Peter Wolf, his brothers-in-law. They were renters; their names are together. In 1772 Lawrence was taxed in adjoining Londonderry Township, now Lebanon County. In 1773 he settled in Buffalo Township, according to his Virginia certificate dated Feb 10-1780 (W Va University Archives). In 1778 his name is on the Ohio County, Virginia tax list. He built a 2-story blockhouse about 35 by 35, with overshots on both sides. There was no stockade, but under the floor was a cellar. (See Forrest's HISTORY OF WASHINGTON COUNTY, PA)

Lawrence was likely the leader in coming to Buffalo. He probably came with Jacob, Peter and Christian Wolf and Michael Dennis and Michael Ely "Jr". William Wolf arrived in 1776 and John Wolf about 1787. Lawrence's land was surveyed and patented 1786-87. His children went to Ohio; some were in Knox County.

Where the farms of Lawrence Stricker, Hardman Horn and Michael Ely "Sr" joined, land was given for a church, which became known as Wolf's Meeting House. On Mar 5-1802 (DB S, 402) Hardman and Elizabeth Horn, Lawrence and Barbara Stricker, Michael "Sr" and Mary Ely (Ili) for 5 shillings deeded 3 acres for a school house, a meeting house and a burying ground. Jacob Wolf was a witness. Lawrence Stricker died in 1816. When his executors sold the farm they "reserved one acre for the Presbyterian and Lutheran meeting-house, best known by the name of Wolf's Meeting House". Today this is the East Buffalo Presbyterian Ch.

MICHAEL DENNIS is listed in the Buffalo region as early as 1778, when his name is on the Ohio County tax list. His farm was surveyed in 1793 with rent from 1784. He died in 1812, signing his will as "Michael Dinges". He may have been a son of Philip Dinges, who came from Daimbach, near Mörsfeld, in 1749 and was in Lebanon Township in 1761. Philip's father, (Johann) Gerhard Dinges, died in Daimbach Mar 5-1743. Michael's children went to Ohio.

The first record of MICHAEL ELY "Jr", who likely married Christina Wolf, is his name on the 1778 Ohio County tax list. In 1782 he was in Captain Eleazer Williamson's (Pa) militia company. His name appears in tax and census records 1783-98. He was a blacksmith, as was Peter Wolf Sr, and on Dec 17-1800 "late of Washington County" sold his tools (which he had rented to John Helt) to William Clemens for \$12.\* In 1810 he and John Helt were taxed in Delaware County, Ohio. In 1822 Michael moved to Morrow County, Ohio, where he died. On the same day (December 17) William Wolf sold to William Clemens a horse, a cow and a heifer. Both transactions are in Washington County deed books.

The following is a summary of the three brothers-in-law:

As stated above, the relationship of Michael Ely "Jr" and Michael Ely "Sr" is unknown. They were nearly the same age. Michael "Sr" arrived in Buffalo about 1790, bought the farm adjoining Stricker and Horn in 1791 "late of Dauphin County", joined with Stricker and Horn in the 1802 deed, died in Buffalo Township in 1819.

To Washington County

JACOB Wolf settled in Buffalo Township, where he and son John died.

WILLIAM Wolf left Buffalo in 1801 and went to Canton Township. He was in Ohio 1818 to 1828. He died in Washington, where his sons who stayed in Pennsylvania lived. Some of his children were members of what is now First United Methodist Church (Washington), as were some of the grandchildren of John.

JOHN Wolf lived and died in Canton Township as did three of his sons. Two of the stone houses built by his sons are still standing in Wolf-dale, (a suburb of Washington) formerly Wolftown.

PETER and CHRISTIAN Wolf went to Ohio.

Jacob and John signed as Wolff, William as Wolfe.

William Darby, noted American geographer, was born on Swatara Creek in 1775 on the farm (Dixon) adjoining that of Peter Wolf Sr. In December 1834 in THE CASKET (Philadelphia) (copy, courtesy of J. Gerald Kennedy, biographer of Darby) Darby tells about coming to Washington County, Pennsylvania in early December 1781:

William Wolf, who had been an intimate acquaintance of my parents on Swatara, had removed with his brothers and sisters and settled on Buffalo Creek, 5 or 6 miles westward of Washington (Pa). This man was with us.

Darby said his mother spoke German.

Darby in a letter written Aug 1-1845 (Draper Manuscripts 8NN - State Historical Society of Wisconsin) said:

With my parents, brothers and one sister, an infant, (we) reached where Washington (Pa) now stands on Christmas Day 1781.

On January 1-1846 he wrote:

On New Years Day 1782, I ate my dinner in Jacob Wolf's stockade fort, sitting beside my little companion, Sabina Wolf.

The NATIONAL INTELLIGENCER, Nov 6-1851, tells more about the Darbys. Patrick Darby, William's father, in the spring of 1781 went from Swatara to Washington County and started a cabin on land belonging to William Wolf, an "intimate acquaintance". Darby planted a crop, cleared land and in the fall returned to Swatara. In late October he started west with his family. They crossed the Monongahela at Brownsville November 25, where William Wolf met them. They lived at Wolf's fort until the cabin was completed in late February 1782. But in a few days they fled, because of the threat of Indians, back to the fort. In late March they moved to a farm near Washington, never returning to the cabin.

When William Wolf had his land surveyed in 1786, he stated (October 16) that he was:

driven from the place through force or fear of the Indians during the late war and his place was left without inhabitants.

A family tradition tells of Jacob being driven from his cabin and on returning finding James McBride living in it. The two men decided to settle with their fists and Wolf won. Whether or not this is true, in the 1778 Ohio County court record is an ejectment suit by James McBride against Jacob and Christian Wolf.

Jacob Wolf was appointed a lieutenant in the Ohio County militia on July 6-1778. He had built a blockhouse around his cabin. It was never attacked by Indians, although in September 1782 an attack was made on Rice's fort about 10 miles to the west. Crumrine in his HISTORY OF WASHINGTON COUNTY (page 678) tells of several persons fleeing to Wolf's

fort for safety. One was Christiana, daughter of James Clemens. The fort was just south of present US 40, 5 miles west of Washington.

On Nov 2-1779 roads were ordered laid out from Jacob Wolf's west to Claysville (Thomas Waller's) and east to Washington (Ohio-Yohogania county line). On Jun 6-1780 Ohio County court gave Jacob Wolf permission to open an ordinary (tavern) and post these rates:

breakfast or supper \$4	horse overnight with hay \$6
dinner \$6	pasturage \$3
lodging, clean sheets \$3	1 gallon corn \$5
1 quart strong beer \$4	1 gallon oats \$4
$\frac{1}{2}$ pint whiskey \$6, with sugar \$8	

This was during the high inflation of 1780, so the prices tell little. James Clemens was surety for the Wolf ordinary.

On Mar 9-1782 Jacob Wolf bought (DB A, 35) from John Saylor a tract of land in Strabane (now Canton) Township. Included in the sale were 2 horses, 8 cows, 5 hogs and grain. Saylor may have been leaving because of Indian threats. William Wolf was a witness to the deed. On this Saylor land were living Peter Wolf Jr in 1783 and John Wolf from 1788. On Feb 16-1785 Jacob Wolf sold (DB B, 50) a tract of land to the northwest of his Buffalo Creek land to John Lane, who took out a warrant for it in 1788.

Peter Wolf Jr was taxed in Strabane in 1783 and 1784. In 1783 he had 250 acres, 2 horses, 3 cows. In 1785 he was in Donegal (now Buffalo) Township, living midway between James Clemens and Jacob Wolf. Peter was a witness to the will of James Clemens in 1795. He did not warrant land. He later moved to Finley Township, Washington County.

Christian (often listed as Christly) Wolf appears in the Ohio County tax lists in 1778. He served in the Pennsylvania militia in 1782 and was taxed in Donegal 1782-84 and 1789. He is not in the 1790 census. He is said to have "gone to Ohio". There is no further record.

### The Land

Jacob Wolf had difficulty with his land. He did not warrant his farm until 1813. When it was surveyed it was given the name "Negligence". About 1785 William Wolf had applied for about 400 acres on the waters of Chartiers Creek. At the time of the 1786 survey he said that he was mistaken; it was on Buffalo waters. A warrant was granted Feb 22-1786 and a 385-acre tract, "Wolf's Hollow" surveyed for William Wolf Sep 20-1786. He was charged rent from 1784.

The 385-acre tract was to be for William and Jacob. William paid Jacob to handle the financial end. In 1794 the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania took action against William for not paying the fees for the land. So in September 1794 William sued Jacob for trespass and was awarded \$120 damages in 1798. William had his part (200 acres) resurveyed Nov 22-1798 and took out a patent Jan 22-1799 and sold it two months later. He left Buffalo about 1801 for on Dec 17-1800 he sold a horse, a cow and a heifer to William Clemens, son of James. In 1814 William Wolf was assessed in Canton Township for 1 dog. For a time he was a school teacher. He lived in Ohio from 1818 to 1828. Jacob Wolf and son, John, warranted "Hope" and "The Lodge" in (now) Donegal Township (701 acres) in 1793 and 1794. They likely never lived on it. The Buffalo farm is shown here with the dates of settlement of neighbors. Both Jacob and William claimed the section marked "JW".

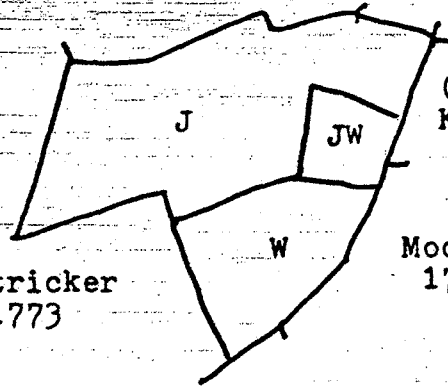

The Saylor tract that Jacob Wolf bought in 1782 had not been warranted, so John Wolf had to buy it Apr 13-1789 (DB G, 71) - 355 acres for £ 532-10 from Kennedy Morton of Washington. Morton had patented it 18 days earlier. William Wolf was a witness to the deed. William and Peter Wolf owed Morton money Mar 18-1790. Morton named the survey "Wolf".

Peter found land about 15 miles southwest of Wolf's fort on Robinson fork of Wheeling Creek. This is now West Finley Township. The land was almost on the state line. Peter paid taxes in Finley 1792-93 as a non-resident. In 1794 he was taxed for a gristmill, 111 acres, 2 horses and 2 cows. He bought the land for £ 136-14-7 on Jun 5-1799 (DB Q, 246). The land had been patented by Thomas Shields of Philadelphia in 1798. Peter sold the land to his son, John, Mar 25-1805. One week later Peter bought land across the line in West Virginia. About 1809 John moved to Ohio. When he sold the land in 1814 he was in Coshocton County, Ohio. In 1810 Peter was in Ohio County; soon after (c1813) he joined John in Ohio, dying in Knox County about 1829. Two of Peter's children married children of Abraham Enlow of East Finley Township. Another married Christian (son of Hardman) Horn.

The tax lists for Donegal (now Buffalo) show the following:  
(Peter was in Strabane 1783-84. John was never in Buffalo.)

Military Service

Washington County was formed in March 1781. The militia records (1782) (Pa Archives, VI, 2) show:

Captain Eleazer Williamson (a neighbor)

Privates, Christian Wolf, Peter Wolf, Michael Ely, Jeremiah (son of James) Clemens, and neighbors to the west

Captain William Leet

Privates, Jacob Wolf, George Kline, Joshua Martin, and neighbors to the east

There is no clear military record for John Wolf. He may be the John Wolf who was in Battalion 2, Company 2, Lancaster County militia under Captain Michael Holderbaum of Lebanon. Swatara men were in the company.

William Wolf's service record is given in his pension application S24020, pension granted Apr 23-1833. After the Revolution William was a scout under Lewis Wetzel. William Wolf on the trip with the Darbys entered into an animated description of the west, making a mere thing of shadows of Indian war.

But his pension application made Nov 12-1832 tells of three 6-month periods engaged in scouting for Indians - from April to October. It was likely the years 1777 1778 1779, rather than the ones he cites. In 1780 he likely went back east for his wife. He says:

He was born in Lancaster County, Pennsylvania on the 14th day of March 1757, where he resided until he was 19 years of age and then removed to Washington County in the spring of 1776, where he resided until March 1818, when he removed to the state of Ohio and resided there until March 1828. He then returned to Washington County. He has no record of his age. The Bible in which his father recorded the ages of his children was unfortunately burned together with his father's house and other property in Lancaster County.

Could the Indians have burned the house?

William went scouting as far as Grave Creek. He names these forts: Biggs' (West Liberty), fort at mouth of Indian Wheeling Creek, Colonel Stryker's (5 miles up Wheeling Creek), Zane's (Wheeling), Miller's (Buffalo Creek), Ryerson's (now Greene County), Mason's (Buffalo), Dickerson's (Chartiers Creek).

The last year he served under Captain Eleazer Williamson and Colonel David Williamson. In the 1833 pension application of John Allison, William Wolf tells of serving with Allison in 1778 and 1779. He names Rice's Fort and Vanmeter's Fort.

This is his pension application:

When he entered the service of his country lived in Buffalo Township in Washington County, Penna. The first term of his service was for six months commencing the first day of April 1776 (1777). He was a volunteer under the command of Col David Williamson, Maj Henry Dickerson and Captains Jacob Miller and Charles Bonner and Zachariah Biggs and Eleazar Williamson and Capt Brady were also in the same service. We were all engaged as "Indian spies" traversing the country from Washington, Penna to and along the Ohio river as low down as the mouth of Grave creek in Virginia.

Some part of the tour he was stationed at Biggs' fort, where West Liberty now stands, but generally he was under arms scouring the country and defending the frontiers from the incursions of the savages.

My second term of service commenced about the first of April 1777 (1778) and ended the ensuing fall, or commencement of winter, when the weather became so cold and severe that there was no longer any danger to be apprehended to the settlement from the inroads of the Indians. My third tour of duty commenced at the breaking up of winter about the last of March 1778 (1779) and continued 'til the snow covered the ground in the autumn.

For the last two terms I was drafted and served under the command of Col (then Capt) David Williamson, who was the commandant of all the troops in this service from Washington County. Major Dickerson, Capt Bonner, Capt Biggs, Capt Miller, and Capt Williamson were officers under Col Williamson. During the campaign of 1778 (1779), I was under the immediate command of Capt Eleazar Williamson and marched with him to the fort situated near the mouth of Captina or Indian Wheeling creek in Virginia, from thence we marched to a fort commanded by Col Stryker situated on Wheeling creek about 5 miles above the place where the town of Wheeling now stands.

I also spent a part of the summer in and about Zane's fort, which was situated on the very ground where Wheeling is located. Some part of this summer I also spent at Biggs' fort where West Liberty now stands, at Miller's fort on Buffalo creek in this county, at Ryerson's Station in Greene County, at Mason's station on the waters of Buffalo and at Major Dickerson's fort on the waters of Chartiers creek.

At none of these places I stayed more than a few days at once. We were almost constantly on foot traversing that rugged country lying between the headwaters of Chartiers creek and the mouth of Grave creek on the Ohio. When we did stop it was only for a short time to rest our fatigued bodies and recruit our languishing spirits. To detail my services during the spring, summer and autumn of 1777 (1778) would be in effect to repeat what I have already said with regard to the subsequent season with this exception that I was forted for one whole month at West Liberty without being much in active duty. My whole services during these three seasons amounted to at least eighteen months for which, although I was promised a liberal compenstion, I never received a single cent. About the first of November 1778 (1779) I received a discharge from Col Williamson, which I did not consider a paper of much importance and therefore it has been lost or destroyed.

The following names persons can testify to my character for veracity: Ebenezer Brownlee, Joseph McKee, Thomas Chambers, James Allison Esq, William Clemens Esq, Simon Ashbrook, Martin Horn and Joshua Dickerson Esq. Two persons have a personal knowledge of my services, viz Hugh Workman (who lives in the Borough of Washington, Pa) and Jacob Wolf.

#### Sabina Wolf

An oft-told tale concerns Sabina Wolf, Jacob Wolf's oldest daughter, who in 1789 at 18 married Judge Hugh H. Brackenridge, 41, later a Pennsylvania Supreme Court judge. Brackenridge owned land near the Wolfs, but did not live on it. Michael Ely "Sr" bought his land from Brackenridge.

A contemporary account by John Pope in October 1790 in his A TOUR THROUGH THE SOUTHERN AND WESTERN TERRITORIES OF THE UNITED STATES OF NORTH AMERICA (Richmond 1792) is as follows:

Mr Brackenridge on his way from Washington court, called in at Mr Wolf's to have his horse fed and escape a rain which was then descending. The horse was fed, the rain had subsided and Mr Brackenridge to avoid wet feet, ordered his horse to be brought to the door. Miss Wolf was directed to perform that office.



Nut brown were her locks, her shape was full strait,  
 Her eyes were as black as a sloe;  
 Milk white were her teeth, full smart was her gait,  
 And sleek was her skin as a doe.

These allurements made a deep impression upon the susceptible heart of Brackenridge. He prevented her in the servile office, mounted his nag and off he went. He had not gone more than a Sabbath Day's journey before his horse, at the instigation of the rider, turned short around and revisited Mr Wolf's. A familiar application was made to the old gentleman for his daughter, which he considered as nothing more than pleasantry in Mr Brackenridge, for which he is so remarkable. Mr Brackenridge declared that he was serious, that his intentions were honorable, and that his future happiness rested on the event of his then application. Miss Sabina had been employed in shrubbing the old man's meadow, which saved him the august expense of about ten dollars. This with him was an insuperable objection to parting with his girl. Mr Brackenridge obviated the difficulty by paying down a sum of money, obtained the young lady's consent, married her and sent her to Philadelphia, where she is now under the governance of a reputable female character, whose business will be to polish the manners and wipe off the rusticities which Mrs Brackenridge had acquired whilst a Wolf.

We shall never know exactly what happened.

Sabina's granddaughter, Mary Brackenridge Ewart, said Sabina was a beautiful woman. Her portrait was painted by Peale in Philadelphia about 1810. She was noble, prudent and handsome, quite as intelligent as her husband, Judge Brackenridge.

### Religious Services

Preaching services were held at Dutch Fork, a few miles to the west by Henry Fullenwider 1775-85 and by Casper Simler 1785-1802. These were in German. To the east there was Methodist preaching by Elijah Sheckle, a local preacher, as early as 1772 at nearby Reason Pumphrey's. Wolf's Meeting House was built in 1802. Services were in English and German. Christian Newcomer, a United Brethren leader, says in his JOURNAL for June 18-1809:

This forenoon I preached in a church to a numerous audience. After preaching I went home with Mr. (Christopher)

Winter. At night I preached at Jacob Wolf's.

Wolf's was 10 miles east of Winter's. The church, where Newcomer held services in the morning, was at Dutch Fork at the Zion United Brethren (now United Methodist) Church. The church, built about 1799, was an important one in the early days.

The cabin of Michael Dennis was a Methodist preaching point 1784-86. JOURNAL of Francis Asbury - Methodist preacher and later bishop

July 8-1784 I preached at Dennis', to a wild people, on Acts xiii, 26. Since last Friday (July 2) we have ridden 160 or more miles, on rough roads, through a rough country, and with rough fare.

June 25-1786 (Sunday) We had a wild company at Dennis', to whom I was led to be pointed, on Isaiah lv, 6, 7. After preaching we ate a little bread and butter, and rode 15 miles to Doddridge's Fort. We arrived just a sunset and I was comforted in the company.....of my old friends from Maryland.

JOURNAL of Robert Ayres - Methodist preacher on Redstone Circuit  
 August 26-1786 Preached at Friend Dennis' to a few people. Had sorrow to find the people so ---.  
 October 7-1786 Preached to a very small number a farewell sermon, for the people here seem to reject the counsel of God against themselves, therefore we must leave them to go to those places where the people are willing to hear.

Later Years

In 1785 Jacob Wolf was taxed for a still. In later years he became a staunch temperance man and disposed of his still. On June 7-1793 he was named a squire. In the 1798 Direct Tax his house was valued at \$350. # Peter Wolf's at \$10. Brother John's houses were valued at \$150; a 2-story log house 25 x 24, with 3 adjoining cabins 20 x 16. There is no listing for William Wolf, who likely lived in Jacob's \$24 one. Jacob and other family members are buried in the cemetery at Wolf's Meeting House - now East Buffalo Presbyterian Church. Some years ago the tombstone of Jacob was repaired by Leonard Judson Wolf of Indiana.

Jacob Wolf died in Buffalo 1835 at 91, John Wolf in Canton 1833 at 86, William Wolf in Washington 1839 at 82. Average age 86. Jacob had 2 sons: John and Jacob - Jacob (Jr) went to Ohio about 1820. John had 4 sons: Jacob, John (Jr), William, Henry - Henry went to Ohio about 1818. William had 5 sons: William (Jr), Peter, John, Simon, Christopher - John went to Wheeling (W Va) about 1831, Christopher to Missouri c1850.
