Joseph Abate, 87, of Slovan, died Friday, July 8, 2005, in Weirton (W.Va.) Medical Center.

Mr. Abate attended Burgettstown High School and was a U.S. Army veteran of World War II, serving in Germany and Panama. He was Purple Heart recipient.

He served as superintendent of maintenance for the state Highway Department.

Mr. Abate was an active member of the community and was actively involved in local politics. He was instrumental in the building of the new Burgettstown Senior Citizen Center. He was a Smith Township tax collector and retired from Robinson Township Water Authority. He served on Smith Township Water and Sewerage boards and Pennsylvania Municipal Water Board.

In 2000, Mr. Abate was awarded the Stunda Memorial Good Egg for his service to the community as a driver for Meals-on-Wheels and for his help with the Veterans of Foreign Wars Health-O-Rama.

He was a charter member of Slovan VFW Barto Post 6553, where he held several offices, and was a member of Burgettstown American Legion.

He was of Scotch descent on his father's side of the house. His grandfather and his great-grandfather came from Scotland and settled in York county, Pa. His grandfather, when still a young man, came from York county to Western Pennsylvania and settled in Hanover township, Washington county, where he lived the remainder of his life in the midst of thrift and plenty. He made an application to the State for a patent for four hundred acres of land, and his request was granted. This land has been owned and largely occupied from that day until the present by people by the name of Armor. Alexander McCandless Armor owned at the time of his death a part of the original four hundred acres. It was on this land he was born, and where he lived the first sixty years of his life.

His grandfather was married to Jane Moore, to which union were born seven children, the youngest of whom was the father of Alexander McCandless Armor. HOMESTEAD NOW GOES TO FIFTH GENERATION

Murdocksville, May 9.—Following an illness of but two weeks' duration W. S. Armor, a lifelong resident of this section and a member of a family which has held land here for more than a century, died this morning at 11:30 o'clock at his home near Murdocksville. He was 72 years of age and breathed his last on the farm on which he was born and where he had spent his entire life.

This farm which has always been Mr. Armor's home was taken up in the early days by Mr. Armor's great grandfather. After his death it descended to the grandfather of W. S. ARMOR—April 1, 1913, at his home in Burgettstown, Pa., Mr. Alexander McCandless Armor, in the 80th year of his age.

He was of Scotch descent on his father's side of the house. His grandfather and his great-grandfather came from Scotland and settled in York county, Pa. His grandfather, when still a young man, came from York county to Western Pennsylvania and settled in Hanover township, Washington county, where he lived the remainder of his life in the midst of thrift and plenty. He made an application to the State for a patent for four hundred acres of land, and his request was granted. This land has been owned and largely occupied from that day until the present by people by the name of Armor. Alexander McCandless Armor owned at the time of his death a part of the original four hundred acres. It was on this land he was born, and where he lived the first sixty years of his life.

His grandfather was married to Jane Moore, to which union were born seven children, the youngest of whom was the father of Alexander McCandless Armor. His family connections were members of the Hopewell Presbyterian church, Presbytery of Pittsburgh. His uncle, Thomas Armor, and his father, James Armor, were ruling elders in this church. He himself was elected to the same office when only thirty-three years of age, and he accepted the position with much hesitancy on account of his youth. He transferred his church membership in 1890 to the First Presbyterian church of Burgettstown. He was elected to the office of ruling elder in this church in the spring of 1893, where he continued to serve until the time of his death. He united with the church when seventeen years of age and lived a consistent member for a period of almost sixty-three years. He was twice married. In 1865 he was united in wedlock with Anna Moreland, who lived but a few years in that happy relation. In 1882 he became the husband of Mrs. Rebecca McClusky, who preceded him to the better world by five years.

Mr. Armor was a man of remarkable and exceptional piety. To him God was a loving Father. Filial duty was to him a pleasant task. He also was a man of excellent judgment. He filled the place of an elder in a very fitting, reputable manner. He was uncompromising with everything that had the appearance of evil. He had great regard for the Christian Sabbath and its requirements; the personal influence of his life was deeply felt by the other members of session and greatly appreciated. Therefore, he it resolved,

First, that we bow in humble submission to the will of God, who has removed from our midst our brother and adviser, who has ceased from his labors and whose works do follow him.

Second, that a copy of this obituary be spread on the minutes of our sessional records and also sent to The Presbyterian Banner for publication.

JAMES MORELAND ARMOUR

Scion of Pioneer Family, Dies

James M. Armour of the Clinton-Frankfort Road died Saturday morning May 23, at his home. Born July 17, 1868 on the farm on which he spent the last twenty years of his life, he was the son of W. Sample and Sarah Moreland Armour. His family on both sides, of Scottish, Scotch-Irish and English extraction, was among the settlers of Western Pennsylvania prior to the American Revolution and had a share in establishing colonization. Through his mother, Mr. Armour was a direct descendant of Capt. Joseph Huston, a member of the Expedition against the Indians of Sandusky Valley, Ohio, in 1782. The paternal ancestor, Thomas Armour, settled on an eight hundred acre tract

of land in 1774. The original homestead, the birth place of five generations of the pioneer's descendants, is now the Thomas E. Armour family home.

Mr. Armour received his early education in the Fort Dillow district school and later attended a Military Academy at Ada, Ohio. In his youth he united with the Hebron Presbyterian church. He was married to Miss Adella M. Rover of Bellevue, Ohio in 1892. After spending two years in Pennsylvania, they went to Bellevue to make their home. Mr. Armour was a car inspector for the Nickle Plate R. R. until he lost his right hand in an accident. Mrs. Armour died in 1915.

About 1920, Mr. Armour and his wife who was Mrs. Mabel Reigle of Sunbury, Pa., removed from Bellevue to the old home farm where they built a cottage and busied themselves with poultry raising and gardening. As a member of the Frankfort Springs Presbyterian church Mr. Armour was treasurer of the congregation and taught the adult Bible Class. He was a member of the Hanover Township School Board for several years and in politics a staunch Democrat.

Besides his widow he leaves three brothers, Clement M. of Sewickley, W. George of Lisbon, Ohio and Thomas Edgar at the farm, also a sister, Mrs. William T. Leggo, Philadelphia, two nieces, Mrs. Arthur B. Stout, Pittsburgh, Miss Mary Raye Armour, Philadelphia, and a grandniece, Carol Ann Stout.

Services were held at the home Monday afternoon by Rev. Biddle with burial in the family lot at Grandview Cemetery, Florence, Pa.

DIES ON FARM HELD BY FAMILY FOR OVER CENTURY

Following an Illness of But Two Weeks W. S. Armor Passes Away at His Home Near Murdocksville—He Was 72 Years of Age.

HOMESTEAD NOW GOES TO FIFTH GENERATION

Murdocksville, May 9.—Following an illness of but two weeks' duration W. S. Armor, a lifelong resident of this section and a member of a family which has held land here for more than a century, died this morning at 11:30 o'clock at his home near Murdocksville. He was 72 years of age and breathed his last on the farm on which he was born and where he had spent his entire life.

This farm which has always been Mr. Armor's home was taken up in the early days by Mr. Armor's great grandfather. After his death it descended to the grandfather of W. S. Armor, Thomas Armor, who left the land to his son, James Armor, the father of W. S. Armor. The farm will now go to T. E. Armor, the youngest son of W. S. Armor, who represents the fifth generation of the family to consecutively hold this land.

Mr. Armor's death was the result of a leakage of the heart which resulted in blood clots in the veins. For many years Mr. Armor had been an elder in the Frankfort Presbyterian church and had been active in the work of the congregation. In politics he was a Democrat.

Oldest Woman Washington Is Dead

Washington county's oldest resident Katherine Baker, of Crosscreek Village, is dead at the age of almost 102 years. Following a general breakdown a few days ago the aged woman had sunk gradually until death came Saturday morning at 3 o'clock. Funeral services will be held today at 10 o'clock from the Baker home, conducted by the Rev. O. S. McFarland of the Presbyterian church. The interment will be in the old Crosscreek burying grounds adjoining the church.

Had Miss Baker lived 30 days longer she would have been 102 years old. She was the oldest citizen of Washington county and it is believed the oldest in Western Pennsylvania.

More than a century ago in a little log hut located on what is now the Letitia Liggett property in Independence township and for many years called the Magee farm, Miss Baker first saw the light of day. Her father was Thomas Baker who came to Independence township from Ireland before that section was settled to any extent. He took for his wife Anne Crothers of the Taylorstown section and 15 children were born to them, Katherine being among the oldest. She received her education in one of the primitive log school houses with no windows located on the farm now owned by J. E. Vance.

After the death of her parents Miss Baker moved to the village of Independence where she lived for many years. About 25 years ago she moved to Crosscreek Village where she had spent the remaining part of her long life. When she reached the century mark the citizens of Crosscreek held a big celebration in her honor and she was given her first automobile ride on a new brick road that had just been completed in the Crosscreek vicinity.

Miss Baker in all of her long years had enjoyed the best of health and was able to be about until within the past few days. She had always been active and when she reached the century mark was able to read some without glasses and spent a great deal of time sewing quilt patches. She had kept going until the last spark of life was used up. It was only the past few days that she had taken her bed and then she was able to be up a short time each day. Her death was not caused by disease, the human machinery simply having worn out.

Two brothers of Miss Baker who had spent their life in their native township lived to be almost 85 years age.

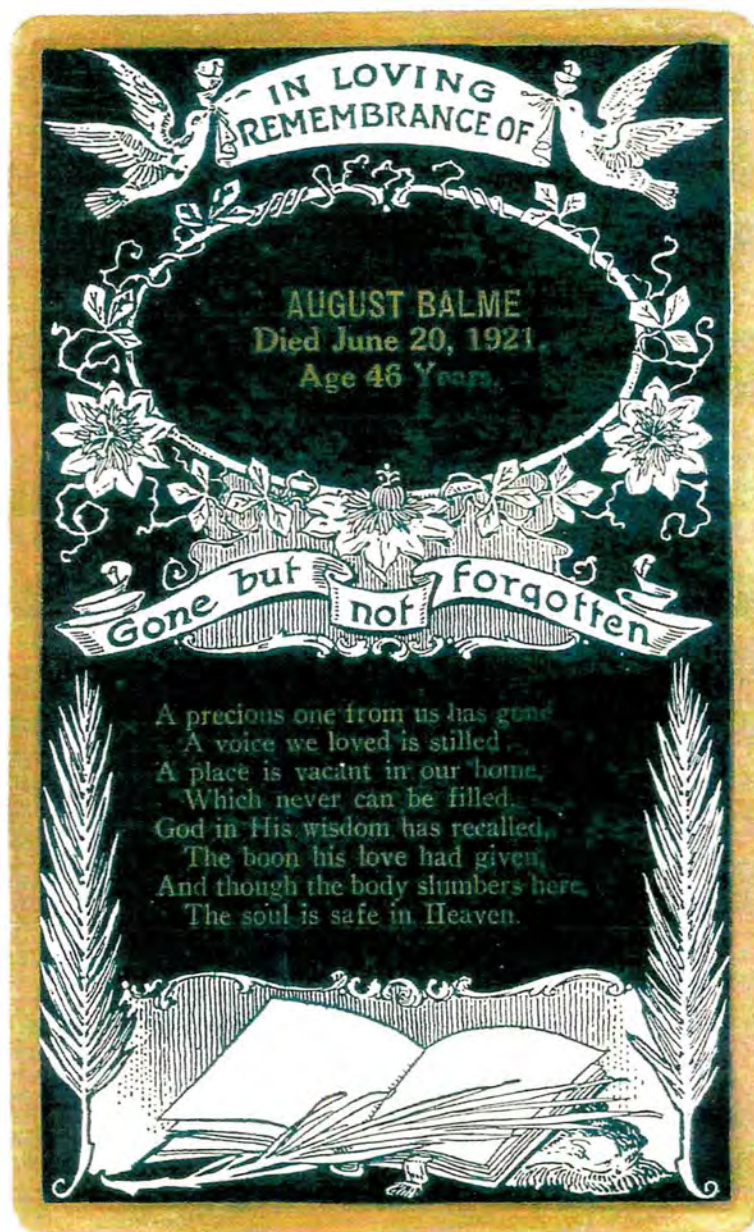

Plunging into seven feet of icy water in the reservoir of the American Zinc & Chemical Co. plant, at Langeloth, about 2:30 o'clock Saturday afternoon, Joseph Harpula, aged eight years, and Romeo Bango, aged 10 years, lost their lives as thin ice broke under them while playing about the dam.

Plant workmen noticed the lads on the ice and called a warning to them as they reached about the middle of the reservoir where the ice gave away. Both sank before aid could reach them. Ben Zancaner attempted to reach the boys by breaking the ice with his hands and wading to the rescue, but he was unable to swim and when he reached deep water had to give up the attempt.

Other workmen built a raft and after laboring more than an hour the bodies were recovered by Tony Wilgocki, James Sèreso and Frank Leske. Dr. F. S. VanKirk, Langeloth physician, was summoned and the bodies taken to the emergency hospital of the plant, but efforts to resuscitate the boys were unavailing.

Joseph was in the third grade of the Langeloth center school. He is survived by his mother, Mrs. Angeline Harpula, five sisters and two brothers: Mrs. Edward Galan, of Langeloth, and Victoria, Julia, Caroline, Jean, and Brown all at home.

Romeo was in the fourth grade of the same school. He leaves his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Romeo Bango, and five sisters: Saraphina, Luvina, Carmina, Mary, and Lila all at home.

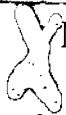

THOMAS BIGGER

MEMBER OF PIONEER FAMILY DIES AT HIS HOME NEAR MURDOCKSVILLE

Thomas Bigger, one of the very oldest and most highly respected residents of Robinson township, died at his home near Murdocksville on Wednesday night, July 15, 1908, in the 84th year of his age, after a lingering illness.

Thomas Bigger was born on the twenty-third day of November, 1824, in the old Bigger homestead, now owned and occupied by his brother Matthew in Robinson township. He was a grandson of Thomas Bigger, who came to this country from Ireland in 1773 and settled on a piece of land near Hickory, this county, which belonged to George Washington. The case was then in court, and after Washington established his ownership to the tract Mr. and Mrs. Bigger went to Robinson township and settled on the land which is still in the Bigger name.

The name of the father of Thomas Bigger, the subject of this sketch, was Samuel Bigger and his mother's maiden name was Jean Wills. Thomas Bigger was the first born of eleven children. Of this number one died in infancy and the remaining ten all grew to manhood and womanhood, and eight brothers and sisters survive him.

At the age of fifteen years he removed with his uncle, Thomas Bigger, to the farm on Raccoon creek, on which he continued to reside from 1839 until the time of his death. He was married in October, 1854, to Esther Donaldson, and of this union five children were born, three of whom survive him: Judge Thomas M. Bigger, of Columbus, Ohio; A. D. Bigger and Miss Jennie Bigger, the two latter residing with the deceased at the time of his death. His wife died in March, 1863.

A terrible disaster occurred at the Blankensop Bros.' Iron Foundry at about 1 o'clock Thursday, by which Joseph Blankensop, the senior proprietor, met with a sudden and violent death.

It appears that he, and his brother John were doing some grinding with a couple of emery wheels mounted close together on the same shaft and revolving with great velocity. Joseph had finished the iron he was working on, and as he stooped, one of the wheels burst and a piece struck him sideways on the back of the head, tearing away the scalp, and part of the bone and making a ghastly wound from which the brain protruded and oozed. He was of course knocked senseless, though not paralyzed. It was soon seen that his case was past all surgical aid. He died at about half past four. The wheel that burst was about fourteen inches in diameter, two inches thick, weighing about fifteen pounds and broke into three pieces, the one which did the mischief passing up through the roof, crossing the street and falling in the yard beyond. In 1840 to New Romney, Ohio. Was P.M. Appointed Colonel, 3rd Regiment, 2nd Brigade, 14th Division Ohio State Troops by Governor Corwin. Began the study of medicine and removed to Florence this county. In 1846, Governor Shunk appointed him Surgeon's mate of 2nd Regiment, 14th Division, Penna Troops. Graduated at Columbus, Ohio Medical College in 1850 and remained in Florence until he bought out Dr. G. W. Bell, and came here in the fall of that year. He continued the practice of medicine here until his death. Except for a short interval in which he lived at Holiday's Cove, West Virginia and Steubenville, Ohio. In 1871, he was appointed Associate Judge of Common Pleas. The office was abolished at the end of his term. He was a member of the Presbyterian Church. He was highly respected by all who knew him. Many will remember him by his acts of benevolence and charity. His only son, William S. was killed in the final assault of Fort Fisher, North Carolina, in January 1865. This is documented in a handwritten ledger recorded by William Melvin. Melvin, a resident of Burgettstown, PA once worked for the Census Bureau in Washington D.C. As a resident of Burgettstown, he was a secretary of many organizations and recorded deaths in the borough from its 1881 incorporation to the turn of the century.

Clarence H. Brockman, 95, of McDonald, passed away peacefully Tuesday, November 17, 2015, in his home, surrounded by his many World War II, Steelers, Pirates and Penguins items, and his dog, Beni, and daughter Barbara, by his side.

He was born June 26, 1920, in Midway, a son of the late Clarence and Ruth Welch Brockman.

Mr. Brockman was a 1940 graduate of Midway High School. He entered the U.S. Army in July 1942, where he served in the 80th Infantry Division, 317th Regimental HQ Company, Communications Team and received an honorable discharge in October 1945. During World War II, he received the first of two Bronze Stars for valor for holding his position during the Moselle River Crossing, he fought in the Battle of the Bulge, and on April 11, 1945, he was part of the liberation of Buchenwald Concentration Camp.

There are several books with brief stores of his World War II experiences, "The Liberator" and "They Say There Was a War."

In April 2014, he was honored by Pittsburgh Penguins, where he received his own personalized jersey and they honored him again this past Veterans Day. In June 2014, on military appreciation night at a Pittsburgh Pirates baseball game,

he was honored as "Fan of the Game." On September 8, 2015, he was honored by the NFL and Pittsburgh Steelers during their "Salute to Service" presentation.

He was a direct descendent of Col. John Canon, founder of Canonsburg.

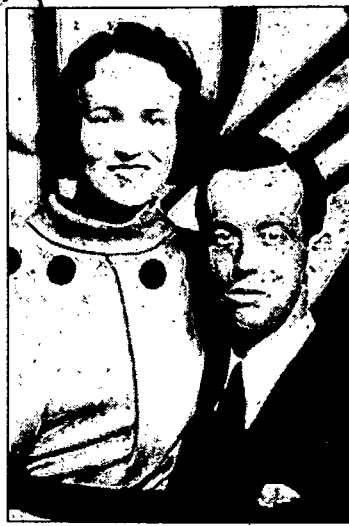

At 16, she graduated from Hickory as the May Queen and valedictorian. Her former high school, Cecil, honored her at graduation.

Following graduation, she played basketball with the Coca-Cola All Stars, a semi-pro team. She studied nursing at Mercy Hospital, but even with a scholarship, the Great Depression forced an end to her career aspirations.

She had a love for beauty and flowers and found her talent as a floral designer. She and her husband, William, ran Brown's Greenhouses in Hickory. Besides gardening, she also loved collecting antiques, sewing, interior decorating, traveling and especially ballroom dancing. Waltzing was her specialty.

Mrs. Brown enjoyed cards and belonged to Hickory Bridge Club. She was past president of McDonald Garden and Hickory Women's clubs.

Surviving are sons Ronald of Pittsburgh, John of Bucks County and Thomas of McMurray; a daughter, Sally Brown-Pawlosky of Hickory; seven grandchildren; six great-grandchildren; and numerous nieces and nephews.

She also will be missed by her dog, Lassie, and loyal cat, Bunnie.

John L. Brunner, Veteran State Legislator, Succumbs At Age 50



Veteran State Legislator John L. Brunner, 50, of 15 Frederick Street, Burgettstown, died Tuesday, January 1, 1980, in the Mercy Hospital, Pittsburgh, after an illness of more than a year with a blood disorder.

For 16 years he had served this area in the Pennsylvania House of Representatives as a Democratic party legislator. He also held a law office in Burgettstown.

Brunner represented the state's 46th District, which includes 16 communities in Beaver County; the boroughs of Burgettstown, McDonald and Midway; and the townships of Smith, Jefferson, Hanover, Robinson, Mt. Pleasant, Cross Creek, Independence and Cecil.

Brunner was first elected to the House of Representatives in 1964, and was reelected in 1966, 1968, 1970, 1972, 1974, 1976 and 1978. At the time of his death he was serving as chairman of the House finance committee.

During his years in office, Brunner supported the construction of the dam which will become Cross Creek Park, the extension of Route 50 from Cecil to Hickory, the cleaning of the mine

pollution in Raccoon Creek, area road projects, and the improvement of water systems in several local municipalities.

He established his law practice in Burgettstown in 1958.

Brunner, who was the Assistant District Attorney in Washington County from 1957-60, ran unsuccessfully in county primary elections for District Attorney in 1967 and in 1971.

A graduate of Union High School in Burgettstown, Brunner was a graduate of Duquesne University and Georgetown University Law School. While in law school, Brunner worked as a guard in the House of Representatives and was present when a group of Puerto Rican nationalists fired shots in the chamber.

He was born August 18, 1929, in Langeloth, a son of Violet Riley Brunner and the late John J. Brunner.

He was a member of Our Lady of Lourdes Roman Catholic Church; the Knights of Columbus; and the Washington County, Pennsylvania and U. S. Bar Associations.

He was a veteran of the Korean conflict.

Attorney J. G. Buchanan dies

John G. Buchanan, a prominent Pittsburgh lawyer for 74 years, died of heart failure yesterday in his Shadyside home.

Mr. Buchanan, who was 97 years old, was passionate about the study and practice of law.

"The law has been my love. Oh, how I love the law," he said during an interview in 1981 when he was 92. "That's why I try to keep up with it still."

But although the walls of his handsomely appointed office, then on the 57th floor of the U.S. Steel Building, Downtown, were almost totally covered with memorabilia and autographed tributes from judges, he said he never wanted to sit on the bench.

"I never wanted to be a judge. I wanted to be an advocate," he said.

Mr. Buchanan, president of the Pennsylvania Bar Association from 1944 to 1946, was a partner in the law firm of Buchanan Ingersoll Rodewald Kyle and Buerger and its predecessor firms from 1916 to 1977, when he was named counsel to the firm. It is now called Buchanan Ingersoll Professional Corp.

In 1920, members of the U.S. Supreme Court presented Mr. Buchanan an autographed photograph after he won a case before that court. Samuel Williston of Harvard Law School, whom Mr. Buchanan described as the greatest teacher he ever had, autographed a photo for him. In his office hung a photo of President Woodrow Wilson who, when he was president of Princeton University, had Mr. Buchanan in his undergraduate classes on jurisprudence and constitutional government.

"He was the second greatest teacher I had," Mr. Buchanan was fond of saying about Wilson.

Learned Hand, a judge of the U.S. Court of Appeals, paid this tribute to Mr. Buchanan in another autographed photo:

"To John G. Buchanan, who inherits with his name the subtlety, the rectitude and the valour of a great

people." In 1969, he received the award of the Fellows of the American Bar Association "for adherence to the highest principles and traditions of the legal profession."

Mr. Buchanan, a ruddy-faced, stockily built man who in later life had a fringe of white hair and wore a turned-up gray felt hat, was a familiar sight in Shadyside where he lived on Amberson Avenue.

Until his 80s he walked to Downtown, first from his home on Murray Hill Avenue in Squirrel Hill and then from his home in Shadyside. He walked from Shadyside to Downtown, he recalled, in 65 minutes.

In later years he tried to walk 35 minutes a day, weather permitting, but then for a time a broken ankle restricted his daily walks, especially when he had to carry an umbrella in one hand and a briefcase in the other. If the weather was bad, he walked around the inside of the U.S. Steel Building.

The son and grandson of surgeons, he was the descendant of Buchanans who came to this country from Northern Ireland. Born in what was then Old Allegheny, now the North Side, on July 24, 1888, he graduated from Shady Side Academy, took his undergraduate degree at Princeton in 1909 and his law degree from Harvard in 1912.

At Princeton Mr. Buchanan was in a graduating class one year behind that of John Foster Dulles, who became secretary of state in the Eisenhower administration. In 1952, before he attained that office, Dulles came to Pittsburgh at Mr. Buchanan's invitation to address the Allegheny County Bar Association.

Mr. Buchanan never lost interest in Princeton or Harvard. He was an alumni trustee and later a trustee emeritus of both Princeton and Princeton Theological Seminary, and chairman of the Princeton Library Committee. He was president of the Harvard Law School Association from 1949 to 1951. In law school, he had been case editor of the Harvard Law Review and in later years he was a member of the Overseers Committee to visit Har-

vard Law School.

During World War I, Mr. Buchanan was a first lieutenant with the Sanitary Corps of the National Army and a captain with the Army Judge Advocate General's Office.

Mr. Buchanan's first wife, Charity A. Packer Buchanan, whom he married in 1916, died in 1949 and in 1959 he married Olive Elizabeth McDougall. In later years he would say of his second wife, "I wouldn't be here at 92 if not for her."

Tragedy struck Mr. Buchanan with the death in 1970 of one of his three sons, John G. Buchanan Jr., a member of the same law firm. Mr. Buchanan, then nearing 82, was vacationing in Spain when he received a telephone call that his son had died. A portrait of John Jr. hangs in the Buchanan Room, a conference room of the law firm, which also has a Buchanan Library.

Mr. Buchanan taught at the University of Pittsburgh Law School from the third year of his practice in 1914 until 1937. A part-time member of the faculty, he was offered a full professorship but turned it down in favor of remaining in practice.

Mr. Buchanan recalled that he won his first 17 cases after being admitted to the practice of law. In 1918, he was admitted to practice before the U.S. Supreme Court.

He received honorary degrees of doctor of laws from Pitt in 1954 and from Waynesburg College in 1959. He was a member of the procedural rules committee of the Pennsylvania Supreme Court from 1937 to 1945 and was the Jaycees' man of the year in law in 1957. A Fellow of the American Bar Foundation, he received its 50-year award in 1969.

Surviving are his wife, Olive Johnson McDougall Buchanan; two sons, Dr. Gibson P. of Fox Chapel, and James J. of New Orleans; 11 grandchildren; and two great-grandchildren.

Friends will be received in East Liberty Presbyterian Church from 11:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. tomorrow, when services will be held there. Burial will be private.

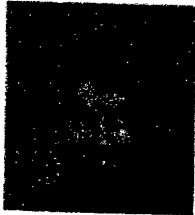

History of Burgettstown Post-Office

The Burgettstown post office was established April 25, 1810 and began to operate Jan. 1, 1811.

Postmasters who have served the office:

Thomas Miller was the first, 1811. M.S. Stevenson, 1920; S.J. Perry 1821; David Bruce 1822-1830; Dr. Stephen Smith 1830-1934; Jess Spencer 1934-1864; Leander A. Robb; Samuel P. Wilson, 1866-1874; David W. Fry and John W. Fry.

The above office located in what is now known as the Old Town or South Burgettstown.

The Pennsylvania Railroad was started in 1852-53 and completed in 1865 and the new town or the part "Down by the Station" was laid out in 1854, and called Abilene and lot number 6 in this plan is the location of our new post office today.

The post office in the new town was established April 1, 1870 under the name Cardville. James A. Galbraith was the postmaster and J.D. McCabe the assistant. In about one week after the office went into effect, Mr. McCabe received a commission as postmaster. Successors of Mr. McCabe were J.C. Ralston and George M. Miller.

In 1883 the post office department abolished the post office in the Old Town, known as Burgettstown and changed the name of the office known as Cardville, to Burgettstown, Pa.

It being known to a few of the patrons of the office in the Old Town that it was to be abolished, and effort was made to retain it, but it was too late; however they succeeded in having an office established under the name of South Burgettstown to go into effect as soon as the old office was abolished. Postmasters in the South Burgettstown office were J.W. Fry, W.P. Scott, W.B. Porter, Forbus Ferguson, 1914-1916, Mabel Todd 1916 to about 1920 when village delivery service was installed from the Burgettstown office at which time the South Burgettstown office was abolished.

The first postmaster in the new town after its change from Cardville to Burgettstown was George Miller. And his successors were as follows: R.T.C. Stephenson, S.F. McClure, E.K. McFarland 1896, J.T. Patterson who died in office was succeeded by his daughter Nora Patterson, E.G. McGregor, J.F. Shillito, D.V. Hays, J.F. Scott, Wayne Culley and Ralph L. Bell, 1936.

Burgettstown's office is the second class and boasts of serving a population from 25,000 to 30,000 which includes in addition to the Boro of Burgettstown, parts of Smith Twp, Cross Creek Twp., Jefferson and Hanover Townships.

The personnel of the office at the present time are in addition to the postmaster J.H. Stewart, senior clerk; Howard R. Dunbar clerk; Miss Naomi B. McPeake clerk; Frank L. Taucher clerk; G. Edward Bish carrier, Shirley T. Bruce carrier; Clyde Bigger carrier; Charles E. Murphy, carrier R.D. 1; George W. Pyle, carrier R.D.2; Albert R. Rosey; carrier R.D. 3; John L. Culley, carrier R.D. 4; H.A. Hitchcock

Mail messenger and Richard Rosey, special delivery messenger.

Post Office Site

(In the heart of the Bituaimous Coal Region)

The land on which Burgettstown is situated was located by Sebastian Burgett, a native of Germany who migrated to this country sometimes before 1773. The land was taken up on a Virginia Certificate about 1780 and in later surveys and patents the tract was known as "West Boston".

The site of the New Post office building dates back to February 1, 1736, when the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania conveyed the land by warrant to one Thomas Whitaker. At that time it contained 411 acres and 119 perch; usual gold and silver ore rights were reserved by the Commonwealth. The site remained the property of the Whitaker clan until about 1843 when the Deacon Whitaker laid out a plan of lots known as "Abilene". During the years from 1854, the site of the new post office was owned by Robert Fay, Adeline Pyle, John C. Fulton and his heirs, Robert Ferguson, J.L. Proudfit, George Stroud, Lewis Baker, George Perritte sheriff, Samuel Hindman, James Gillespie, Nancy Walker, and Dr. W. E. Dickson. On November 17, 1949, Dr. W. E. Dickson and Walter A. Fulton passed title of the site to the United States.

Thru the efforts of our Congressman, the honorable Charles I. Gauddis, the sum of \$75,000 for a new post office at Burgettstown was allocated by an act of Congress, Aug. 25, 1937.

The plans specifications of the new building were prepared by the Federal Works Agency, Public Buildings Administration, and Washington D.C.
